Top Tips when considering rural theft, personal safety and domestic violence

- 1. Do not put yourself in danger, if urgent call 999
- 2. A registration number is always helpful but do not put yourself in danger
- 3. Sign up to Farmwatch here Farm Watch | Avon and Somerset Police or Farm watch | Devon and Cornwall Police (devon-cornwall.police.uk)
- Avon and Somerset (A &S) are able to offer farm visits to chat over lowering risks to your farms and offer monthly drop in's at the Cutcombe Market.
- 5. Little Book of Big Scams The Little Book of Big Scams 5th Edition (westyorkshire.police.uk)
- 6. Check email addresses thoroughly, scammers use odd formats in the addresses
- 7. Look after the elderly, scammers are very convincing.
- 8. Wear reflective gear so you can be seen to ensure your own personal safety
- 9. Be mindful of wearing headphones
- 10. If exercising, tell someone your route and estimated time of arrival
- 11. Internet dating meet in a public place, consider taking a friend or let them know where you are.
- 12. Don't leave your drink unattended and know the signs of drink spiking <u>Spiking how</u> to protect yourself on a night out | FRANK (talktofrank.com)
- 13. Useful apps for tracking Hollie Guard Personal Safety APP
- 14. Domestic abuse is a hidden crime, 1 in 5 are reported to the police

Every farmer who participates will become a member of The Prince's Countryside Fund's Farm Resilience Network which provides a bank of resources and ongoing support. 
