Tom's group has completed all the asphalt work on Tryon to Mullen and Trenton North, and are just doing final cleanup as we speak.

Following is all the work lined up for the Asphalt Division next year:

- Finish Eustis to Cozad and Lincoln County 2021 around 6,000 tons
- North Platte East Bridge and Arapahoe West Bridge about 700 tons each as a sub.
- In Arapahoe and North 70,000 tons
- Anselmo to Merna 55,000 tons
- Kingsley Dam South 63,000 tons
- Culbertson South 46,000 tons
- Mullen South and Tryon North 100,000 tons
- Custer County Asphalt 31,000 tons

As you can see, we will be quite busy. It will take a big effort from everyone to get it all done.

Finally, this will be my final "Pride" update. It has been my honor to work here the past 13 years. I'll be moving back to Lincoln where my two sons and all four grandchildren live.
