

Winter temperatures are finally here, and both crews are in the process of moving equipment back to Cozad for repairs.

Randy & Tom/Seth's crews finished several projects this year with smaller crews than normal. Below is a quick review of the asphalt paving year.

- Kingsley Dam 63,560 tons
- Lincoln County 3,700 tons
- Mullen South paved 46,000 tons remaining 3,300 tons in the spring
- Tryon North paved 30,000 tons remaining 25,000 tons in the spring

The below work is booked for next year not including the tons to be completed in the spring for the above projects:



The portables have some work finishing up both Valentine paving jobs and the hog building job, then off to Aurora for another airport job. Our new plant will be first set up at Ogallala for the white topping job on Hwy 30 between Rosco and Ogallala. We are currently bidding some feedlot work for the next job hopefully.


The new beef packing plant in NP is just getting started. We are scheduled to do the auger piling grout shortly after Christmas. This will be a very handy job as we share a property line with them. Hoping to hear more from them any day for the rest of the concrete packages. Ogallala continues to have some nice work pop up. They are currently working on a new Runza restaurant, along with a new motel and an apartment building. Gothenburg has some nice winter work starting, a large building for Wearparts and a large community daycare center. We have some NDOT work scattered around the plants as well. I look for another busy year in 2023.

I do want to thank Roger Henthorn our plant manager in McCook for his couple years of service. Roger has decided to chase another adventure, so we were lucky enough to get a very qualified applicant to come talk to us about the opening. On January 6 th, Kelly Doyle will be starting as our new plant manager in McCook. If you get a chance, stop by and say hi and welcome him to the team!!

Winter meetings will be here soon, good news is that some of the classes are getting combined. This should result is a few less trips to Cozad for training this winter.

Justin, Don, Steve, and crew have finished the Wahoo Airport, Lexington Landfill, and now they are finishing up the small Lexington City job. As of right now, they will open up in the spring doing the whitetopping from Ogallala to Roscoe, and then go on to Columbus for a three-year job.

Darrell, Mike, Sam, and crew are still working on the Valentine State job. They are now about 90% done with this job. We will finish this in the spring. They have also been working on the Valentine City job, which is about seven blocks long. We have finished about 65% of that job. We have gotten to where we wanted to get to and we will finish this job in the spring. They will have these two jobs to do in the spring, plus we have the Valentine taxiway to do. After this is finished, they probably will do the Aurora taxiway job.

Cesar and his crew have finished the two North Platte jobs and are now trying to pretty much finish the Cozad job. If weather cooperates, we will just have some drives and a sidewalk to finish up in the spring. They will then go to the Broken Bow Airport apron job. We will be bidding some more jobs that are coming up. There is a two-year job on the one ways in North Platte, and a small City paving job in Gothenburg, and I am sure there will be plenty more jobs to bid.

Gary Wendt and Logan are now working on getting things staked out for our next year's jobs in Ogallala, Valentine, Aurora, and Columbus. They will get a few miles in next year.

Jed, Mike, and I greatly appreciate all the hard work everyone has done this year. As we close out the year, make sure we have our equipment sheets done on what equipment needs fixed for next spring. Shane is balancing additions to three elementary schools for Lexington Public Schools. Work is progressing at all locations and will be completed this spring and summer.



Ground Breaking at Cozad Community Schools




Holdrege High School Weight Room Addition

Gravel

Weather seems to be on and off; warm one day, cold the next. Nights are getting colder, so it is getting harder to get running in the mornings with the ponds being frozen over.

Paulsen, Inc. purchased T&F Sand and Gravel on November 1. We did not get the trucking business, just the dredging operation. The gravel pit is southwest of Elm Creek. The purchase came with a lot of nice equipment. They do stuff just a little bit different than we do. I have already seen some things they do that I would like to try. So, that means we ended up with two new employees. Welcome to Paulsen, Inc., Shane Lambertus (dredge operator) and Michael Schroll (loader operator).

Larry also bought a building for Sand and Gravel to use. It is the old Hood Trucking building. The location is east of the warehouse, about one mile on the gravel road. We are currently working on it off and on, putting more insulation up on the walls, and going to put corrugated galvanized tin on the walls. Hopefully, by the time you get this we will be working in there, rebuilding things for next year. It has an oil burner inside; when we service equipment and put the used oil in 55 gallon barrels, make sure the caps are on

tight after each use. I would also put them at a slight slope, so water runs off the top.

Lexington, Indianola, Gothenburg, North Platte, and Elm Creek are still pumping. We are trying to get a jump start for next year to make sure we have enough materials to make it through the winter months.

Ogallala and Cozad are froze out. They are tearing dredges apart and are working on the rotary and tower.

Gates is shut down. We are moving the rotary, working on the dredge and rotary trying to get most of the repairs done before next spring.

The Maintenance crew is running dozers, loaders, some dredgers, and are working on the repairs for the new building.

The Final McSafety's Corner

December 29 is my final day with Paulsen Inc. I don't want to say that I am retiring but moving onto my own safety consulting business. Back in 1981 my life took an unexpected journey that has brought me to this day. My father-in-law was suffering with cancer and my wife Jeannie wanted to move back to Cozad for a year or two. I spoke with Bob Cornelius who took me over to meet with Ike Paulsen and they offered me a job with the asphalt department. So, my music career was on hold – little did I know how permanent that change would be.

I started out driving a dump truck — instructions: just get in you'll figure it out. Then I worked for Larry Hock, patching crew, intersections, parking lots and of course silage pads. Then over the next few years helping run the patching crew and working with the paver and moving equipment as needed. I learned to run all of the equipment in the Asphalt — instruction: just get in you'll figure it out (kind of a recurring theme). In June of 1983 I lost my right eye when the new blade on the concrete saw exploded — safety goggles you bet — hanging around my neck.

After working for Paulsen Inc. for 4 ½ years a friend of mine talked me into buying a truck and putting it on with NSG which showed me just how stupid I could be. I thought about going back into music, but I loved to work outdoors (well most of the time). So, at the end of the year, I got rid of the truck and came back to Paulsen Inc.; moving equipment and running the patching crew. Then I started working with Gary Hofferber and learning to run the asphalt plant.



We put an asphalt plant in Elm Creek which I managed along with the best guy ever to work with Gale (Red) Hendricksen. A few years later I took over as Project Superintendent. In 1993 the position of Safety Director opened and I got a visit from Bob and Dave Yocom. They thought it was a position made for me and Larry told me to take it over.

When I began, there actually wasn't a lot in place and a lot to learn and computers were a new thing. Thanks to the AGC and OSHA's Rocky Mountain Education Center, we improved our drug testing program and winter safety training. We continued doing safety meetings at the Elks with safety binders then overhead projector slides.

When we moved into the new office building, we had our own training room, but we outgrew that and moved the meetings to Chipper Hall.

I can't praise Larry enough for creating one of the most state of the art training theaters in the state — I've never been in one better.

I know that Carlos Avalos will do a superb job as Safety Manager and Jacob Rush is growing into his role as Environmental / Safety Assistant and they will take the Safety Program to the next level.

The thing I treasure the most is the people I've worked with over the years; Larry Hock, Red, Wally Woltemath, Ron Buettner, Al Kuszak, Randy Deans, Don Rowland, Julie Mellman, Yo-Bob, and so many more with Asphalt. I mention them because we all worked, sweated and busted our butts together. I thank all those whom I have worked with as your Safety Manager especially Scott Holbrook, Carlos, Jacob, Andy Pflaster, Cort Bullock, and even Chris Hunke. I've thoroughly enjoyed it.

I want to thank Larry Paulsen for giving me the opportunity to be in this position and for allowing me to say goodbye as I sail off to a new challenge.


