The corporation was incorporated by Harold Eason on 10/13/61 as Eason Service system, Inc. The land was purchased by the family in 1922. 
He started in fire prevention as a Fire Inspector in January 1998 and became the Deputy Fire Marshal in 2008, Fire



Dorothy 89, passed away peacefully at her home

Dorothy was born in Denver on May 9th, 1931 and was the only child of Hazel and Herman Deakin. She grew up on a small farm in Riverdale which is now part of Thornton. Dorothy spent her early learning years at the small two floor Riverdale School. First thru fourth grades were on one floor and fifth thru eighth grades on the other level. Dorothy skipped 6th grade as she was the only one in that class and went to seventh.

Growing up in the thirties and forties were the yers of the Great Depression and World War II. Hard times were the rule and families had to scrape and scratch to make ends meet. Dorothy learned to cook, sew and to can foods at an early age from her mother. She took piano lessons and became very good at the keys.

Her parents were quite active in the Henderson church and Dorothy accepted Jesus as her LORD and Savior before she was a teenager. Her faith grew stronger as the yers added up.

Dorothy was a freshman at Adams City High School in the fall of 1944. Also in that class was Bob Hutchings. Bob's family had a trout farm just 3 miles south of Riverdale. Her beautiful smile and bubbly personality soon attracted Bob. They became high school sweethearts during their sophmore year and the rest is history.

Dorothy and Bob were married on July 15th, 1951 and Bob went over to Wiesbaden, Germany in early Spetember during the Korean War where he served for 18 months in the U.S. Air Force. After returning from overseas they were reunited at a Texas Air Base for 8 months and then discharged November 16th, 1953. They lived with her mother at the Riverdale home until January 1955 when they moved into Bob's home on the trout farm. Daughter Barbara Ann was born in 1955 and Carl was born in 1956.

Dorothy was active as room mother and also in PTA thru the school years. She was alwlays a helping hand on the trout farm and the steadying force behind the family scene. She loved working in the garden and had flowers blooming from Spring thru Fall. Barbara and Carl both graduated from Adams City H. S. making them 3rd generation graduates. After graduation from C.U. & C.S.U. they also married high school sweethearts.

Dorothy is survived by husband Bob just 165 days short of their 70th wedding anniversary. 
Dorothy was a founding member of the Commerce City Historical Society.


On Sunday May 2, we will have plants for sale at the museum. They will be available until they are sold out but do not wait too long because they go fast.
