So, in summary, you get an income tax deduction and reduce your capital gains tax, but more importantly, more goes to M.A.S.H. Pantry & Resource Center.

Without using up cash funds that could go to your retirement plans, you'll reduce your tax bill, so that cash that would have been paid to the IRS now will go to our veterans and survivors around the city and throughout the greater community.
