Treasurer's Report

We are nine months into the budget year and the Pledged Revenue received to date is \$671,700 the budget for the same time period is \$602,500, so we are \$69,200 ahead of the budget.

The excess can be attributed to a large IRA distribution. General Fund expenses were \$588,900 compared to the budget of \$618,300, so we are \$29,400 under budget.

The Gundlach Family Fund supported 12 rental requests, \$4,150, with requests received from Hope Inspired.



Seventh Annual Virtual Pie Sale Is Underway

November is an incredibly special time of the year for Senior Adult Ministry (SAM) and for that matter, Messiah as a whole. Our Seventh Annual Virtual Pie Sale has started, and we need your help to add to its success.

Our primary recipient is Second Harvest Food Bank (SHFB).

We will also send a donation to our brothers and sisters at Christ the Shepherd Church ELCA in Altadena, California. They went through that horrible fire earlier this year. We do not want to forget them just because the fire is out.

SHFB has suffered some serious cuts in federal funding, yet the need for food continues to grow. Yes, the food bank is where SAM volunteers every other Monday. SAM has a strong partnership with SHFB.

The food bank presently distributes to over three hundred food pantries in sixteen south central Wisconsin counties.

SAM made 200 homemade apple pies ten years ago and the proceeds went to SHFB. We did this for three years and then COVID-19 came calling. That is when we switched to virtual pies and the rest is history!

We encourage you to donate to the virtual pie sale, knowing that your gift will be multiplied **FOUR** times! I do not know of any other fundraiser that quadruples donations and feeds so many people. Please note...not one penny stays at the church—it all goes to SHFB and Christ the Shepherd Church ELCA.

Many of you may be making year-end donations to different organizations. Right now is the time to donate to virtual pies and have your gift quadrupled. A Messiah family first doubles your donation. Then that amount is doubled again by NBC15's corporate sponsors at the Share Your Holidays Grand Finale in early December.

So how do you "buy" a virtual pie? It is quite easy. You can go online to **messiahchurch.com** and click on "Giving." Then use the drop-down menu and select "Virtual Pies." You may also write a check to Messiah Lutheran Church and in the memo line, write "SAM Virtual Pies." Place your check in an envelope and mark the front of the envelope "SAM—Keith." Do NOT leave a pie envelope in the offering plate as your donation can easily get misdirected.

The last day of the virtual pie sale is Sunday, November 30th.

- 500 Given out at Messiah in Fall 2023, Earth Day 2024 and Spirit Day 2025
- 36 Given out at the Ladies Lunch Bunch
- 50 Given out to individuals
- 50 Given to camp participants
- 24 Given to St. Stephen's Food Pantry
