We are eight months into the budget year and the Pledged Revenue received to date is \$627,000, the budget for the same time period is Stewardship \$535,600, so we are \$91,400 ahead Mission in Action of the hudget. The excess can be of the budget. The excess can be

attributed to the 55 families that have met their 2025 commitment and a large IRA distribution. General Fund expenses were \$519,100 compared to the budget of \$549,600, so we are \$30,500 under budget.

The Gundlach Family Fund supported 12 rental requests, \$4,200, with requests received from Hope Inspired and Journey Mental Health Center.

August was our second full month of the solar panels operating and we saw our bill go down by about \$750 compared to last year's August billing period.



The retreat is an overview of wisdom literature touching on Proverbs, Ecclesiastes and Job. We will briefly explore each book separately and

Women's Ministry Chat Group - 3rd Thursday of each month


Women's Ministry Chat Group meets monthly on the 3rd Thursday - 10:30 AM - noon
