

The week after that trip, I flew to Phoenix, Arizona where I participated in our ELCA Churchwide Assembly, where members from all sixty-six synods in the United States come together every three years to vote on important matters of the church. Much of the focus is around memorials, social statements, edits to our ELCA constitution, but what gained the most excitement was the election of our new Presiding Bishop and Secretary of the ELCA. Being a part of the flow of the Spirit as all 803 members voted for whom they felt is the best fit for this role was an exciting, nerve-wracking, Spirit-filled experience. And its results? My former bishop from Chicago, Rev. Yehiel Curry was elected as the first person of color to serve this role. And Rev. "Cecee" Mills was elected as the first person of color to serve as the Secretary!

It may feel overdue, or strange to think it's as big deal as it is, but the ELCA is still considered one of the largest protestant churches in the United States, and its membership consists of predominately white Americans. For our church body to listen to the Spirit and elect these two phenomenal individuals to lead our church is proof that our church is becoming a more complete body of Christ. The tears of joy I saw on the faces of others as the results were shared is the reason we rejoice together. If you missed my adult forum on the details of the assembly, the PowerPoint of information is in the weekly news!

And if that wasn't enough, after landing at the Madison airport at 11:30 pm, I woke up the next morning and hit the road with six others as we traveled north... and then kept going! North of Lake Superior, and north of Grand Marais, Minnesota, at the end of the "Gunflint Trail". We boarded three canoes and paddled...and paddled...and paddled...nearly 40 miles of paddling, across 15 lakes, crossing 13 portages, sleeping at 4 campsites, and walking through 2 countries! And through the rain, sun, wind, and way too many bugs, we left renewed, connected, and changed.

Each person reflected on just how impactful the week was. How much they learned about themselves, how much they loved being disconnected from the internet, and how much more at peace they were with themselves. One of the

There were many wonderful service opportunities planned including helping these organizations: The River Food Pantry, St. Mark's Food Pantry, The Boys and Girls Club, The United Way, Babies and Beyond, Madison Christian Community Garden, Habitat Restore, plus visits to several nursing homes.



# **Boundary Waters Trip**

Seven (7) members of Messiah traveled north! North of Lake Superior, and north of Grand Marais, MN, at the end of the "Gunflint Trail". They paddled nearly 40 miles across 15 lakes, crossing 13 portages, sleeping at 4 campsites, and walking through 2 countries! Through rain, sun, wind, and too many bugs, we left renewed, connected, and changed.

Each person reflected on just how impactful the week was. How much they learned about themselves, how much they loved being disconnected from the internet, and how much more at peace they were with themselves.





We are seven months into the budget year and the Pledged Revenue received to date is \$570,800, the budget for the same time period is \$468,700, so we are \$102,100 ahead of the budget. The excess can be attributed to the 49 families that have met their 2025 commitment and a large IRA distribution. General Fund expenses were \$462,000 compared to the budget of \$492,500, so we are \$30,500 under budget.



The Gundlach Family Fund supported 7 rental requests, \$2,300, with requests received from Hope Inspired and the Dane County Crime Victim office.

July was the first full month of the solar panels operating and we saw that our bill went down by about \$950 compared to last year's July billing period.

# Senior Choir resumes with our first rehearsal on Thursday, September 18th.


We meet at 7:30 PM in the Community Room. We provide music at the 8:15AM worship service two to three Sundays


Participants will engage in question asking as a method of interacting with scripture. We will also learn through videos, slides and interactive group activities.

**Goodreads summary:** Many people—even many LGBTQIA+ allies —still lack understanding of gender identity and the transgender experience. Trans biblical scholar Austen Hartke brings a biblically based, educational,

and affirming resource to shed light and wisdom on gender expansiveness and Christian theology.

The book offers updated terminology and statistics, weaving ancient and modern stories that will change the way readers think about gender, the Bible, and the faith to which Jesus calls us.

# Human Trafficking Awareness Team - Safe Harbor Speaker

On Saturday, November 22nd and Sunday November 23rd, Jennifer Ginsburg, Director of Safe Harbor Child Advocacy Center, will speak at all the services. She will have a chat session between services from 9:20AM-10:20AM in the Community Room.

The mission of Safe Harbor is to reduce trauma and promote healing for children and adults with intellectual disabilities who are victims of, or witnesses to crime. Safe Harbor provides a trauma-informed, safe, child-friendly environment for best practice forensic interviews; immediate and ongoing advocacy for affected children and families; coordination and support of multi-disciplinary investigations and responses.

You may be asking yourself "What is Human Trafficking?"

Human Trafficking is the recruitment, transportation, transfer, harboring or receipt of people through force, fraud or deception in order to be exploited. In every region of the world, traffickers exploit vulnerable women, girls, men, and boys of all backgrounds for profit. Even without knowing, we might have come across its victims. Traffickers often use violence, blackmail, emotional manipulation, removal of official documents, fraudulent employment agencies, and fake promises of education and job opportunities to trick and coerce their victims.
