The Epiphany of the Lord

January 4, 2026

They went back through a different way!

Dear brothers and sisters,

Today we celebrate the Feast of the Epiphany of the Lord. Epiphany is from the Greek word *Epiphaneia* which means revelation or manifestation. **In the birth of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ (Christmas), God our loving Father reveals Himself in a concrete and physical way.** This is a reminder that for us Christians, God is not a distant or impersonal being. God is near to us, in our hearts, in our minds, on our lips and beside us walking the journey life. God revealed His Son to the shepherds in the fields, to the Three Wise Men from the east and later on in the Baptism of our Lord Jesus in the River Jordan by John the Baptist. In each of these events, God made it clear that He is not only Lord of the Universe, He is also actively present in our world. Our response to these manifestations of God is a total and complete surrender to God who desires to dwell in us. Epiphany is not just another feast of Christmas. It reveals Christ to the world as “God from God” and “Light from Light.” As we hear in the story of the Magi from the East, our Lord Jesus is revealed as the Light of Salvation and the Lord of all nations. Just like these three strange figures, we are called to run towards the Lord. As the Magi said, “we have seen His star, and have come to adore Him.” The Eucharist is the greatest star of God for us Christians. In it, we see not just a symbol, but God Himself. In Eucharistic Adoration, we encounter the very person of God. When we spend time with Him, we are like the Magi, who left everything and traveled in search of the newborn King.

The Epiphany Liturgy also suggests some other important guides that lead us to the kingdom of heaven. The gospel of the feast of the Epiphany says that our Lord Jesus is found, “with Mary his Mother.” Our Lady continues to be the star that guides us to Christ the Light. She is the “Star of the Sea” (Stella Maris) who guides us unfailingly in darkness, in turbulent times, and stormy seas. Let us confidently turn to our Blessed Mother who will always lead us to her son, Christ Jesus our Lord. The star guiding the Magi was not always visible to them, leaving some darkness and confusion. At such a time, they consulted Sacred Scripture, through Herod’s advisors. The Word of God sheds light on God’s will and plan for us. The star reappeared, leading them to Bethlehem and to Christ. When we lose our way or when we are distracted from the path of God, Sacred Scriptures guides us back to God’s plans. Through it, God speaks, leads, consoles, and guides us. As a New Year resolution, we can try to read the Word of God daily, even for a few minutes. This will certainly change our lives.

The Magi, themselves, teach us an important lesson on spiritual encounter. Through the guidance of Scripture and the light of the star, the Magi were led to the great encounter with the Christ Child. Likewise, through our Baptism and reception of the Holy Eucharist, we encounter Christ in a deep and personal way. The gospel tells us that the Magi did not return by the same way but they went back through a different way. This “different way” is a lesson on spiritual renewal and transformation. Having encountered Christ as we do, whenever we receive the Sacraments, especially Confession and Eucharist, we cannot and should not return back through the same old way. Something must and should change in our lives, which makes us go back through a “different way.” Spiritual renewal is a daily and constant journey for us. Like the Magi, we fall on our knees before Christ, especially before his Eucharistic Presence, where heaven and earth meet.

As we continue journey through life, may we encounter the Lord, in the various ways that manifests Himself to us.

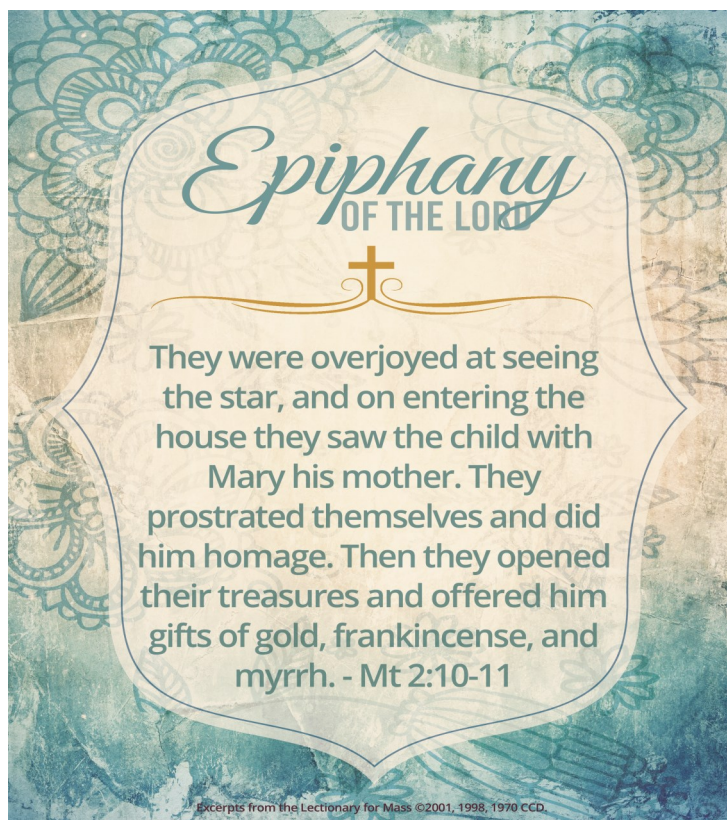

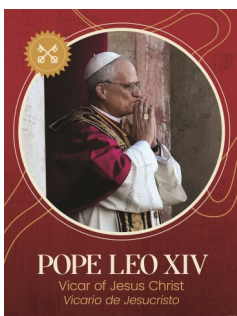
We will always accept toiletry and household items such as bodywash, soap, toilet paper, toothpaste, laundry detergent, and dish detergent.

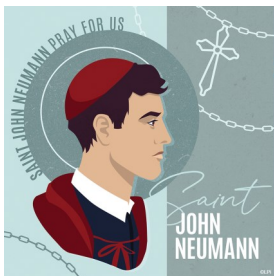

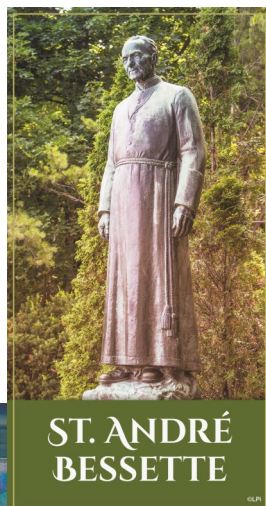
