Special Jubilee of Saint Francis of Assisi: The Poor Man of Assisi

Dear brothers and sisters,

As continue our journey through this first part of the Season of Ordinary Time, let us remember that ordinary time is an invitation to a deeper living out of our Christian faith in the simple and ordinary events of our lives and to active evangelization. Each of us is called, in our unique way, to make the name of Christ known to those around us, family, friends, coworkers, neighbors, etc. This is the simple definition of evangelization.

This year 2026, our Holy Father Pope Leo XIV has given us a great model of faith to accompany us, through his declaration of a Special Jubilee Year of Saint Francis of Assisi to mark the 800th anniversary of his death. The Church usually celebrates a Jubilee Year every twenty-five years. Last year, 2025, we concluded the Jubilee Year of Hope. A special Jubilee Year is usually called by the Pope to mark a significant event or encounter in the Church.

Over the centuries, Saint Francis of Assisi has a special place in the devotional life of Catholics and popular admiration by others. He is popularly known as the lover of nature and the environment and a symbol of peace. But more importantly, the Church celebrates him for his humility and simple life of faith. Saint Francis was born Giovanni di Pietro di Bernardone in 1181 and died in 1226. His Father, who was in France when Giovanni was born, took to calling him Francesco (Francis in English) which means Freeman or French man. The name Francis would stay with him forever. His 44 years was marked with extraordinary internal movements by God. He grew up in a rich family and like all young men of his days, desired to become a knight and become famous. Francis had a profound encounter with God which changed his life forever. During one of his expeditions, he was captured and imprisoned. While recovering, he evaluated his life and decided to turn over everything to God and to His will. Francis renounced his family's wealth and earthly consolations and embraced radical poverty. He gathered a band of brothers and sisters whom we call the Franciscans today. Our parish family is affiliated with Saint Francis because our patron Saint Anthony of Padua became a Franciscan and embrace the life of humility, poverty, and simplicity.

Pope Leo XIV, has declared this special Jubilee Year as an invitation to all Christians to rediscover the radical simplicity and boundless love that characterized Saint Francis' life. He is a model of humility, peace, and care for all creation. These virtues are most needed in our troubled world. This jubilee is a spiritual summons to renew our commitment to living the Gospel with the same fervor and joy that Saint Francis embodied. I see this as an opportunity for our community to embrace forgiveness, reach out to the marginalized, and care for the earth as our common home. In this way, we will rekindle our faith, strengthen our relationship with God and with the community of the Church.

During this Jubilee year, the Church offers us the opportunity to obtain a plenary indulgence. An indulgence is the remission of the temporary punishment due to sin whose guilt has already been forgiven. Certain specific conditions indicated by the Church must be fulfilled: sacramental confession, Eucharistic Communion, certain prayers according to the intentions of the Pope, interior detachment from sin, and the performance of certain works, such as a pious pilgrimage to Franciscan churches, participation in Jubilee celebrations, prayer and meditation in the Franciscan spirit, as well as daily acts of charity and humility that express the spirituality of Saint Francis. May Saint Francis assist us to live our Christian calling as he did.
