

### **DEATH IS NOT THE END**

“I am the resurrection and the life; whoever believes in me, even if he dies, will live, and everyone who lives and believes in me will never die (John 11:25-26).”

Dear brothers and sisters,

With prayer, fasting and almsgiving, we began this journey of repentance, self-restraint, and renewal of our hearts and minds. The Gospel of the last two Sundays have been preparing us for encounter with Christ our Lord at Easter. On the Third Sunday of Lent our Lord Jesus promised living water to the Samaritan woman and on the Fourth Sunday of Lent He, the Light of the world, gave sight to the man born blind. The Gospel of this Fifth Sunday of Lent is the resurrection of Lazarus from the death.

On this Fifth Sunday of Lent, the Church turns our focus from repentance and renewal to the suffering and death of our Lord Jesus Christ, ‘by whose wounds we have been healed’ (Isaiah 53:5). The raising of Lazarus from the dead points to our Lord’s own resurrection from the dead and His promise that **those who put their trust in Him, believe in Him, and walk in His ways, will not see death**. Our Lord’s promise is not simply about this earthly life. We all will die in the flesh. But, through the grace of Baptism, we were buried with Christ and have been called to walk in the light of Christ, be active in our faith and put our trust in God. Through our faith, our Lord Jesus will raise us onto eternal life.

Whenever I celebrate Funeral Masses, especially, with the body of the deceased Christian present in the Church, I am always reminded of this promise of our Lord that **physical death is not the end**. The first preface of the Mass for the dead presents this truth in a powerful way. It says, “in him the hope of blessed resurrection has dawned, that those saddened by the certainty of dying might be consoled by the promise of immortality to come. Indeed, for your faithful, Lord, life is changed not ended, and, when this earthly dwelling turns to dust, an eternal dwelling is made ready for them in heaven.” This is our faith; this is the faith of the Church.

In moments of grief and loss, we think only of the loved one who has gone from us. Martha echoes this sentiment in the Gospel, **‘Lord, if you had been here, my brothers would not have died’ (John 11:21)**. Martha, Mary, and Lazarus were sibling friends of our Lord. They knew of His power and mission. But, in their pain, they did not consider the greatness of God to bring something good out of their sorrow. We too feel this effect of grief. Our dear Lord Jesus assures us that death does not have the last word. He says that ‘whoever lives and believes in me will never die’ (John 11:26). He raised Lazarus back to this earthly life to assure us of this truth. If we believe in the Lord, our earthly life of suffering and pain will not be the end. God our loving Father will gather His faithful and believing children one day in heaven. As human beings, we will miss and mourn our loved ones. But Saint Paul reminds us not to ‘grieve like the rest, who have no hope. For if we believe that Jesus died and rose, so too will God, through Jesus, bring with him those who have fallen asleep (1 Thessalonians 4:13-14). Let us console one another with these words. As Christians, we must believe and also proclaim to others the mystery and hope of the resurrection and everlasting life.

As we approach Holy Week, we pray that our own faith may be strengthened, so that, like Martha, we can place all our hope in Him who is the resurrection and the life! May the intercession of our Blessed Mother strengthen our faith and hope in her Son, especially in moments of trial and difficulty!







### Lenten Obligations

Upcoming day of fast and abstinence is Good Friday (April 3)  
Abstinence applies to all Catholics who have reached the age of 14 and traditionally means abstaining from eating meat.

Fasting applies to Catholics who are between the ages of 18 and 59 and traditionally means limiting oneself to one full meal with two smaller meals which together does not equal one full meal.
