

Easter Sunday April 20, 2025

From the desk of Fr. Cyril Offiong, SDV





Christos Anesti! (Christ is risen!) Alithos Anesti! (He has risen indeed!)

In the liturgical and social lives of the early Christians, the Easter greeting above was given and responded to repeatedly because Easter is everything for a Christian. Without Easter, there is no life and there is no faith. There is no salvation without Easter. The joy of Easter is received and lived in the measure that we received and lived the virtues of Lent. That is, we allowed the Lord to convert our lives, purify our hearts and elevate our souls through His suffering and death. Then, we are exalted with Him in His resurrection. Easter is characterized, above all, by the joy of the glorified life and the victory over death expressed most fully in the great resounding cry of the Church: Alleluia! Because of this gift of God, we proudly and loudly say "we are an Easter people and Alleluia is our song." Easter gives meaning to our faith and sets Christians apart from all other religions, philosophies and ideologies. Saint Paul, writing in his first letter to the Corinthians, says "but if Christ is preached as raised from the dead, how can some among you say there is no resurrection of the dead? If there is no resurrection of the dead, then neither has Christ been raised. And if Christ has not been raised, then empty is our preaching; empty, too, your faith" (1 Corinthians 15:12-14). Our Christian faith is not simply about gathering in love or taking care of the poor or receiving blessings from God, great as these are. Christianity is primarily about faith in Christ Jesus our Lord who rose again from the death so that we might have life. It is this faith in the resurrection of our Lord Jesus that enriches our live and makes us ready and able to do great things for the kingdom of God.

The word "Easter" comes from Old English, meaning simply the "East" or "towards the East." The sun which rises in the East, bringing light, warmth, and hope, is a symbol for the Christian of the Risen Christ, who is the true Light of the world. The Paschal Candle which is blessed at the Easter Vigil and used throughout the Easter Season is a central symbol of this divine light, which is Christ. It is kept near the ambo throughout Easter Time and is also lit at liturgical celebrations such as baptisms and funerals throughout the year.

The Easter Vigil is the "Mother of All Vigils" and Easter Sunday is the greatest of all Sundays. Every Sunday is, therefore, called a "little Easter" because we gather to celebrate the resurrection of our Lord. It is also for this reason that we have the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and on Holy Days. Easter Sunday is such a great reality that it is celebrated for eight days, which we call the Easter Octave. It is a way of prolonging the joy of the day. It ends on the Second Sunday of Easter, also called Divine Mercy Sunday. The season of Easter, which is the most important of all liturgical times, is celebrated from Easter Sunday of the Lord's Resurrection from the dead, through His Ascension to the Father and ends with the coming of the Holy Spirit on the Church on Pentecost Sunday. In all, there are fifty days in the Easter Season.

The reality of our faith is that even after the great Resurrection has occurred, we continue to live in a sort of spiritual tension. We believe that Jesus rose from the dead and that we, too, will one day be resurrected. Nevertheless, life continues, people suffer, the answers we seek do not come, and Jesus our Lord and savior seems nowhere to be found. Sometimes it feels as if God has abandoned us. It is in moments like this that we remember that Christ died and rose again for us. **Because He lives, we can face tomorrow.**

Because he lives, all fear is gone. Because we know He holds our future. Our lives are worth living, because He lives. Christ is Risen, Alleluia! Alleluia!!
