THE CARDINAL (HUMAN/MORAL) VIRTURES

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

The Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC) teaches that 'a virtue is a habitual and firm disposition to do the good. It allows the person not only to perform good acts, but to give the best of himself...The goal of a virtuous life is to become like God' (CCC 1803). Last week, we reflected on the Theological Virtues of Faith, Hope, and Charity (Love). They are called theological because they come from God. This week, we are reflecting on what we call the Cardinal Virtues: **Prudence, Justice, Fortitude and Temperance**. These are also called the Human or Moral Virtues. They are called Human virtues, because we acquire them through human effort, that is, our repeated practice and living out of these virtues. The Book of Wisdom states, 'if one loves righteousness, whose works are virtues, She teaches moderation and prudence, righteousness and fortitude, and nothing in life is more useful than these' (Wisdom 8:7). Our modern culture exalts freedom, independence, and the right to do whatever makes us happy. All these leads to the chaos, individualism, egoism, and sadness that we experience. The Cardinal virtues are truly antidotes for our modern world.

Prudence is the virtue that helps us to discern the true good in every circumstance and to choose the right means of achieving it. Prudence is about discipline in life. With our advancement in science and technology and with more and more options available to us, we often struggle with the right choice to make. The virtue of prudence helps us to choose those things that will work for our good, within our means and that will last. We need prudence in our relationships, in our finances, our health, and other areas of our life. The prudent person is one who applies his or her reason in decision making. Prudence is often called the "mothers of all virtues" because it guides the other virtues by setting the rule or measure of how to act.

Justice is the moral virtue that involves giving to others what is due to them. To God, we owe worship and obedience (true religion) and to our fellow human beings, we owe respect for their rights and dignity. Justice is not vengeance, as our modern world tends to see it. Vengeance is for God. The virtue of justice is the disposition and habit that allows us to give others what rightfully belongs to them and to promote what works for their well-being. The Catechism teaches that 'the just man, often mentioned in the Sacred Scriptures, is distinguished by habitual right thinking and the uprightness of his conduct toward his neighbor' (CCC 1807).

Fortitude 'is the moral virtue that ensures firmness in difficulties and constancy in the pursuit of the good. It strengthens the resolve to resist temptations and to overcome obstacles in the moral life' (CCC 1808). More than ever, we need the virtue of fortitude. We are surrounded by fear, distress, and pressure from all sides. Sometime, even faithful Christians are tempted to give up. The virtue of fortitude enables us to conquer fear, even fear of death, and to face trials and persecutions.

Temperance 'is the moral virtue that moderates the attraction of pleasures and provides balance in the use of created goods. It ensures the will's mastery over instincts and keeps desires within the limits of what is honorable' (1809). One of the strongest vices that our modern society faces is hedonism. This is the idea that pleasure is the ultimate guide to life. We often hear people say, do whatever makes you happy. The virtue of temperance directs our senses, emotions, and appetites, not simply towards what makes us happy, but towards what is truly for our good in the present and in the future. The temperate person lives by what makes him or her a fruitful person.

We do not acquire these virtues overnight nor by simply by willing or desiring them. The great Doctor of the Church, Saint Thomas Aquinas, describes virtue as a habit, which is to say, we acquire virtue by practicing them over and over again until they become part of us. The Human virtues of Prudence, Justice, Fortitude, and Temperance are acquired 'by education, by deliberate acts, and by a perseverance ever renewed in repeated efforts are purified and elevated by divine grace' (CCC 1810). If we desire to live a genuinely happy life, let us be prudent in our decision making, let us be just in our relationship with others, let us stand strong in the face of our fears and weaknesses and let us curb our passions and appetites.

'Brothers and sisters, whatever is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is gracious, if there is any excellence and if there is anything worthy of praise, think about these things. Keep on doing what you have learned and received and heard and seen in me. Then the God of peace will be with you' (Philippians 4:8-9).




