

From the desk of Fr. Cyril Offiong, SDV $\,$

"You have made us for Yourself, and our heart is restless until it rests in You" Saint Augustine of Hippo

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

In my encounters with people, as a priest, I find that in the hierarchy of needs that people express, the top two are a desperate search for the meaning of life and a deep desire for peace of mind. During this summer season, many young people have graduated from one phase of school to a higher one, high school seniors prepare for college or other professions, and college graduates begin the great search in the "job market." Some young and not so young people contemplate God's call to a vocation to the priesthood or religious life. It is often difficult navigating the questions, doubts, despair and confusion that come with these experiences. Without proper guidance and a deep prayer life, one easily falls for the cheap and quick fix which leaves one sad and empty. Without the foundation and support of our faith, young people drift away from the Lord and ultimately abandon the serious practice of the faith. Only in God do we find our true purpose in life.

As I reflect on this reality, I think of Saint Monica and Saint Augustine, whose memorial we celebrated last Wednesday and Thursday, respectively. This mother and son duo teach us a lot about the search for meaning in life and the support and perseverance in the faith. Saint Augustine was raised by his Christian and prayerful mother Saint Monica anda pagan father, Patricius. Augustine did not embrace his mother's faith. For many years, he engaged in numerous immoral relationships, joined different cults, and lived a hedonistic life. Augustine was searching for something in his life, though at the time he did not know what it was. Through all these experiences, his mother Monica persevered in prayer for almost twenty years for him. Divine providence finally prevailed. While seeking to further his career and fame as a rhetorician, Augustine travel to Millan which had the great school in rhetoric. There he met the future Saint Ambrose, who was bishop of Milan. Through his influence, Augustine embraced the faith and with this newfound grace from God, Augustine found peace of mind and a sense ofpurpose. Augustine would later reflect on psalm 4 verse 6 which asks a question and also offers a response 'what can bring us happiness, many people ask. Let the light of your face shine on us O Lord.' Joy is what his soul was looking for. When the soul lacks peace, joy and purpose, it seeks consolation in many destructive ways that turn our hearts away from God.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches that 'the desire for God is written in the human heart, because man is created by God and for God; and God never ceases to draw man to himself. Only in God will he find the truth and happiness he never stops searching for' (CCC 27). After his baptism and instruction in the faith and filled with the fire of God's love, Augustine was ordained a priest and later chosen as bishop of the city of Hippo which is in present day Algeria. Saint Augustine wrote many books on the faith. In "The Confessions", which is a kind of autobiography, he discussed his journey from a wasted youthful life to a life of grace. While reflecting on his own journey and how God's grace led him to the truth. Augustine writes one of his most famous and most quoted lines, 'there exists within every human soul a quiet ache, an unspoken longing that stirs beneath the surface of daily life. This yearning, elusive yet persistent, is the echo of a profound truth: "You have made us for yourself, O Lord, and our hearts are restless until they rest in you." God created us in His own image and likeness. We were made for relationship, for communion, for the endless depths of divine love. In seeking God, our hearts find rest, not in the vanishing shadows of the world, but in the eternal light of God in which we were created to dwell. We are made for worship, and our souls must worship something. If we do not worship the true and living God, we will worship other things, like family, fame, work, sports, relationships, pleasure, etc.

Perhaps, there are many of us who have been praying for children and grandchildren, friends, and loved ones. Considered a personal devotion to Saint Monica and Saint Augustine. Continue to persevere in your own witness of faith and love. Pray for your loved ones and lift them up to the Lord daily. In His own divine plan, God our loving Father will draw their hearts and minds back to His love.

May every restless longing lead us, gently and faithfully, back to the source of all peace, who is God our eternal joy. Saint Augustine and Saint Monica, pray for us.



The Chapel is also open for private prayer time.





One of the main principles of living a stewardship lifestyle is to give without expecting anything in return. This is difficult for some to comprehend in our "consumerist" culture that we live in. This is even difficult for many parish communities that have become heavily dependent on parish fundraising events to support the mission and ministry of their local parish. Generally speaking, at a parish fundraiser, you pay money and receive something in return, it's just a financial transaction. This is opposed to our parish offertory at Holy Mass, where you unite your sacrifice with Jesus', renewing our covenant relationship with him.




