SUMMER MUSINGS

My dear brothers and sisters,

This week, Summer will give way to Fall. Vacations are over (for those who could afford it), children are back to school, and we have also resumed our Faith Formation process (GIFT). As a parish priest, I find that I have a somewhat love-hate relationship with summer. On the one hand, I enjoyed the downtime that summer provides. For about two months, I had very few meetings and commitments. I took the time to plan for the next physical year. I reviewed the Church's liturgical calendar and the cycle of readings for the next few weeks. I reflected on the successive themes for homilies in the coming months. And yes, I also took some time for leisure and "to do absolutely nothing," or at least I tried to do so, with some success, since I am always looking for the next thing to do. On the other hand, I was deeply saddened by some realities. Attendance at Mass and participation in the Sacraments were at a low level, more than I have ever experienced. While it is true that some families were on vacation and others were away for some work or other commitments, many others stayed away. I reached out to a few families, and I received responses such as, "we have been busy fixing the house," or "Rosie has been engaged with dance events," or "Tommy has been busy with sports." Whatever happened to the First Commandment, "I am the Lord your God, you shall have no other God before me," or the Third Commandment, "remember to keep holy the Lord's Day." Someone also told me, "although I have not been to Mass in a while, I still believe in God, and I still practice my faith." Friends, we cannot and should never judge the state of another person's soul, but it is a huge self-deception to intentionally stay away from Mass, the highest form of worship, and still claim that I am practicing my faith. It is an "obligation of Love" to God, who loves us and wants communion with us, for every Catholic to attend Mass on Sundays and on Holy Days. At Mass, we worship God, who in turn nourishes us with His Word and with His Body and Blood, strengthening us with the grace to continue our journey of life. All these issues gave me much to think about. I kept wondering, if it is tough to get people motivated for the one week, how will we make it through the rest of the year? However, the old saying is true, that no one has ever solved any problem by simply worrying about it. And so, rather than complain or become jaded, I brought these issues to the Lord in prayer. I spent many times before the Lord in the Blessed Sacrament, and I asked Him for help. Three fruits came out of my summer musings: Bible Study, Youth Ministry, and Volunteer Drive (or Ministry Fair).

Firstly, Saint Jerome, the great 4th-century Church Father said that 'Ignorance of the Scriptures is ignorance of Christ.' We intend to begin a Bible Study Series later this fall. Some parishioners have already shown interest. We will share more details on this later. I encourage everyone, either personally or as a family, to make plans to be part of this endeavor that will help us grow in our faith. We all need to familiarize ourselves with the Word of God, so that we may live according to His will.

Secondly, it is often said that **children and youth are the future of the church.** While there is some truth to this, this idea often pushes their response to the faith away from the present into the future. I prefer to say that **our children and our youth are the treasures of the present.** We also intend to begin a Youth Ministry that will offer a post-confirmation fellowship and growth in the faith. We will need the help of every parishioner. If you have a young family member or know a family with youths and young adults, or if you know anyone who will benefit from this youth ministry, please feel free to share their contact information with me, and I will reach out to them. We have already identified some of our young people who will help to begin this ministry. We will also need volunteers and chaperones to assist with the well-being of our young people.

Lastly, we are in dire need of volunteers in our parish. I have often praised and celebrated the family and community atmosphere of our parish and the generosity that we show in the care of the poor and those in need. But we lack volunteers to help with some duties for the smooth running of our parish. We are also planning to host a Volunteer/Ministry Drive; to showcase all the areas we need volunteers and how each one of us can help. Please keep these three projects in your prayers.

May our Good Lord prosper the work of our hands and bless the thoughts of our hearts.






