

# From the desk of Fr. Cyril Offiong, SDV $\,$



#### THE POOR AT YOUR DOORSTEP

Dear brothers and sisters,

the gospel for this Sunday is the famous parable of Lazarus and the rich man (see Luke 16:19-31). Our Lord Jesus teaches us the necessity of caring for the poor and those in need. I would like to focus my reflection on an important detail on Charity that we find in this parable. After describing the lavish lifestyle of the rich man and the sumptuous meal he feasted on daily, the gospel says, 'and lying at his door was a poor man named Lazarus, covered with sores, who would gladly have eaten his fill of the scraps that fell from the rich man's table. Dogs even used to come and lick his sores' (Luke 16:20-21). This is an important detail that we can easily miss. The sin of the rich man was not just that he failed to give money or food to the poor Lazarus. His first sin was that he failed to notice the person in need right at his doorstep. Love of neighbor, and generosity to the poor begins by first becoming aware, noticing, and recognizing those in need around us.

In our very busy and hyper-individualized society, we can easily fail to notice the person in need next to us. When think of the poor, let us not only think of those in need physically or materially, but also those who are emotionally and spiritually in need. There are people who are lonely, experiencing great difficulties, and on the brink of despair, but no one around them, not even their family, neighbors and coworkers, notice their pain. We may be contributing to charity and good causes around the country and around the world, but we may also be oblivious of the needy person next door or the poor person on our commute to work or to school or the troubled person who sits next to us in the pews. At the end of the parable, we read that the rich man and Lazarus both died. Lazarus went to heaven and the rich man to hell. The rich man asked God to send Lazarus to help him quench his thirst and later, to warn his family so that they may not suffer hell like him. The rich man wanted Lazarus to remember him. But God denied his request because in life he did not remember nor recognize Lazarus. Psalm 41 verse 1 says 'blessed is he who considers the poor; The LORD will deliver him in time of trouble.'

As you know, I am originally from Nigeria and I belong to a small tribe called Efik, with the language bearing the same name. In my region of the country, we have a legume plant called "Ukana" which grows in a pod. When this plant is mature and ready to be eaten, the pod explodes, and the seeds are scattered far away from the tree where it grows. Based on this action, we developed a saying that, "if you want to benefit from the Ukana tree, you must be distant from it because Ukana is only generous to those far away. We usually use this name to describe people who are obnoxious and unkind to their family and friends, but are being kind and generous to outsiders.

Dear friends, the epidemic of indifference which we struggle with in our society can also be seen in the story of Cain and Abel, the first children of Adam and Eve. Cain killed his brother Able out of jealousy. 'The LORD asked Cain, "where is your brother Abel?" He answered, "I do not know. **Am I my brother's keeper?"** (Genesis 4:9). We Christians are called to be our brother's and sister's keepers. We look out for the wellbeing of those whom God puts on our path. This does not mean that we have to solve all the problems of the world. It means that we must, first of all, be aware of and recognize those in need who are right at our doorstep. Let us make a conscious effort to be aware of those in need around us.

Our Lady, comforter of the afflicted, pray for us.
