THE BLESSED EVER-VIRGIN MARY

Dear brothers and sisters,

In our reflection on the Four Marian Dogmas, we have reflected on the Immaculate Conception of Mary and her Divine Motherhood. This week, we are reflecting on the dogma of the Perpetual Virginity of our Blessed Mother. Let us remember that Every teaching and title that the Church gives of the Blessed Virgin Mary, is always meant to teach us something about our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

In our devotion, we address our Blessed Mother as the ever-virgin Mary. We say this out of devotion and love for her. But we never think of it as dogma. The expression "perpetual virginity," "ever-virgin," or simply "the Virgin Mary" points to the Church's teaching that Mary conceived our Lord Jesus Christ through the power of the Holy Spirit and after giving birth to Him, she remained a virgin. All these different expressions are meant to uphold the divine origin of our Lord Jesus and to speak of the pure vessel, who alone could be worthy to bear the divine person in her womb. Although this teaching has been in the church since its earliest days, the Church formally and officially declared Mary's Perpetual Virginity to be a dogma at the Fifth Ecumenical Council in Constantinople in 553 A.D.

While some people may easily accept Mary's virginal conception and birth of our Lord Jesus, many of our separated brothers and sisters reject the idea that she remained a virgin. They point to passages in scripture that speak of the "brothers and sisters" of Jesus. The Church maintains that our Lord Jesus Christ was Mary's only child. The "brothers and sisters" of Jesus mentioned in scripture are merely close relatives. This might sound strange to many western (that is Eurocentric) cultures. But Jewish culture as well as other middle eastern, African, and Asian cultures often refer to cousins, extended family members, fellow towns people, or people of the same clan as brothers and sisters. One particular instance is of the apostle who is often called James the younger (distinct from James the brother of John) who is called the "brother of the Lord." Tradition holds that he is the son of Alpheus and a cousin of our Lord Jesus. Let us also consider what we read in the Gospel of Saint John chapter 19 verses 25 - 27. While our Lord Jesus hung upon the Cross, Mary His mother stood there with John the beloved disciple. Seeing them, our Lord Jesus said to Mary His mother, "behold your son" and to the disciple, "behold your mother." The scripture adds that "and from that hour, the disciple took her into his home." If Mary had other children, why would our Lord Jesus give His mother to the Apostle John? It is precisely because she had no other child that He made provision for the care of His ever-virgin Mother. More than this, our Lord Jesus was giving Mary to the whole Church to be our Mother.

The Dogma of the Perpetual Virginity, flowing from Mary's Immaculate Conception and her Divine Motherhood, emphasizes the Divine Nature of our Lord Jesus Christ. Since Mary conceived Jesus by the power of the Holy Spirit and without the normal human reproductive process, her virginity remained intact. The virgin birth and Mary's perpetual virginity are signs of Mary's consecration to God, single-minded service to Him, and total abandonment to God's will. Through the centuries, the Church has defended this teaching in the face of opposition. Mary's perpetual virginity matters because she was given to all of us as our spiritual mother, and a symbol of the Church. All Christians would do well to turn to Our Lady and see in her perpetual virginity a sign of God's providence.

Mary, ever-virgin, our Lady Queen of the universe, pray for our salvation and peace, for you are the Mother of Christ, the Lord and Savior.




