

Did you know...



Saint Frances Xavier Cabrini was born in Sant'Angelo Lodigiano, Italy in 1850. She founded the Institute of the Missionary Sisters of the Sacred Heart of Jesus with seven other young women in 1880. She immigrated to New York City from in 1889 to give spiritual and educational guidance to her fellow immigrants living in the United States.

She established sixty-seven schools, hospitals, and orphanages. She died in 1917 and was canonized by Pope Pius XII in 1946 for her service to mankind.
