





MARY QUEEN OF ALL SAINTS

Dear brothers and sisters,

This week, we conclude our series on the Four Marian Dogmas with the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary (see reflections on the last three weeks for the other Marian dogmas). On the Solemnity of all Saints, November 1, 1950, Pope Pius XII, in his Encyclical Munificentissimus Deus, which is Latin for the "Most Bountiful God", solemnly defined it to be "a divinely revealed dogma: that **the Immaculate Mother of God, the ever-virgin Mary, having completed the course of her earthly life, was assumed body and soul into heavenly glory.**" In His Ascension, our Lord Jesus Christ, went up to heaven by His own divine power. In the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary, she was taken up or assumed into heaven by the grace and power of her Divine Son. We celebrate this solemnity on August 15 and contemplate it in the fourth glorious mystery.

The Assumption of Mary is contained implicitly in divine Revelation, and flows rightly from her Immaculate conception, her Divine Motherhood, and her perpetual virginity. Saint Paul writes that 'the wages of sin is death' (Romans 6:23). The corruption of the body after death is the effects of sin. But since God destined Mary to be the Mother of His Son of, He preserved her from the stain of original sin, and she remained a sinless virgin, her body could not experience corruption. Although the assumption of Mary was not formally defined until 1950, the Church has always believed and taught that, at the end of her earthly life, our blessed mother Mary was taken up body and soul into heaven. This should not be a surprising fact because, God already did this, when He took the prophet Elijah up to heaven (2 Kings 2:11). All the more, would God do for His sinless mother. As Mary was mystically bound to her Son here on earth, she is rightly and fittingly united with her Son in Heaven. The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary is not only a sign of her purity and closeness to God. It is also a promise of hope for believers. It reassures us that we are also destined for resurrection and eternal life. What God promised to do for us in the future, He already did for the Blessed Virgin Mary.

On November 1, we celebrate the solemnity of all Saints. The formally canonized saints have a day for their memorial. The Church, in her wisdom, knows that there are countless holy men and women who have gone to the Lord but are unknown to us. So, each year, we remember all of the saints. This is an important feast for us believers because we celebrate what we are all called to be, saints of God. All Saints Day is a celebration of holiness, of sanctity and of our ultimate goal, which is union with God. The saints accompany and assist us on this journey towards heaven. They are those who have survived the time of great distress and have washed their robes and made them white in the blood of the Lamb (Revelation 7:14). Chief among saints is the Blessed Virgin Mother of God. As we conclude our reflection on the Four Marian Dogmas, the Immaculate Conception, the Divine Motherhood, the Perpetual Virginity, and the Assumption of our blessed mother, we ask for her intercession, that we too may live just and holy lives so that at the end of our pilgrimage here on earth, we may be united with her, together with all the saints in heaven and see God face to face.

Mary, queen of all the saints, pray for us.


