

DO NOT BE AFRAID

"The only fear we should have is the fear of the Lord."

Dear brothers and sisters,

There is a quote from President Franklin D. Roosevelt that says, "The only thing we have to fear is fear itself." He went on to describe fear as "nameless, unreasoning, unjustified terror which paralyzes needed efforts to convert retreat into advance." This quote comes from a speech President Roosevelt delivered during the Great Depression a time of immense economic hardship and despair. He sought to instill courage and perseverance in the people at a time of panic and uncertainty, so that they would not fall into fear and despair. Fear, after all, often leads us to retreat and inaction, becoming the greatest obstacle to overcoming the challenges we face.

This week we celebrate the Thirty-third Sunday in Ordinary Time. Next Sunday we will conclude the liturgical year with the Solemnity of Christ the King. As we near the end of the liturgical year, the Church turns our attention to the ultimate purpose of our lives on earth; to prepare ourselves for union with God. There are many things in our world that can disturb our peace. We can either stand firm against these challenges, or we can allow fear to take hold of our hearts and weaken our relationship with God. The readings for this Sunday, especially the Gospel, challenge us to stand up to fear. Our Lord Jesus reminds us that in this life there will be many things that threaten our peace; things that frighten us and cause anxiety. Yet He tells us: "When you hear of wars and insurrections, do not be terrified; for such things must happen first, but it will not immediately be the end" (Luke 21:9).

The phrase "Do not be afraid" echoes throughout the Bible, both in the Old and New Testaments, as God continually reassures His people. This command is not an encouragement to suppress fear, it is an invitation to trust in God's presence, power, and promises. We all face different fears about our families, our health, our relationships, our economy, and our political realities. These can weigh heavily on our hearts. Yet the Lord calls us to trust that He is in control.

To paraphrase President Roosevelt's quote, we can say with Scripture: The only fear we should have is the fear of the Lord. This holy fear, one of the gifts of the Holy Spirit, is not a sense of terror, but a deep awe and wonder before the glory of God. It helps us understand that God is awesome, sovereign, and trustworthy. Another gift we need in difficult times is Fortitude (Courage). Courage is not an absence of fear, but the strength to move forward in doing good, even in the face of fear. When the Lord tells us not to be afraid, He is not ignoring our worries; rather, He is inviting us to place our trust in Him.

I always remember you in my prayers, dear brothers and sisters, as you endure the difficulties of our times and strive to provide for your families. I ask the good Lord to sustain you in your faith, strengthen your courage, and bless your daily tasks. I share with you and encourage you, if possible, to memorize and pray Psalm 23 often.

"The Lord is my shepherd; I shall not want. He makes me lie down in green pastures. He leads me beside still waters. He restores my soul. He leads me in the path of righteousness for his name's sake. Even though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil, for you are with me; your rod and your staff, they comfort me. You prepare a table before me in the presence of my enemies; you anoint my head with oil; my cup overflows. Surely goodness and mercy shall follow me all the days of my life, and I shall dwell in the house of the Lord forever.

May the peace of Christ dwell in your hearts always.

- 2. Masses may be requested for the living or the deceased.
- 3. Donation for each Mass is \$10.00. All checks should be made payable to Saint Anthony's Church.
- 4. If you are making intentions for "Mr. and Mrs." have their <u>first names</u> available so the celebrant can mention them by their first names during the Mass.
- 5. If you do not have the opportunity to come during the above mentioned date and time, the parish office will continue to record 2026 Mass intentions during office hours.
- 6. Beginning Monday, December 1, you may reserve additional Masses (one for Saturday or Sunday, and one for a weekday).
