

GAUDETE ET EXSULTATE (REJOICE AND BE GLAD)

Dear brothers and sisters,

Can you believe it? We are more than halfway through our Advent journey. On this Third Sunday of Advent, we celebrate what we call "Gaudete Sunday." The Church invites us to contemplate the gift of joy. The word "Gaudete" means "rejoice" in Latin. It is an imperative. We are commanded to rejoice. This theme is taken from the entrance antiphon of this Sunday's Mass from Saint Paul's exhortation: "Rejoice in the Lord always; again, I say, rejoice!" (Philippians 4:4). Our rose-colored candle and vestments this Sunday are visible reminders that joy is already among us even as we wait to celebrate the birth of Christ.

In the midst of our preparations, busy schedules, and even our anxieties, Gaudete Sunday calls us to recognize the nearness of God's love. As we know, Advent is a season of anticipation and a time of waiting. We wait to celebrate the mystery of the First Coming of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ into our world, and we also look forward to His promise to return again in glory to judge the living and the dead. This waiting for the Lord can become a daunting task and we can easily give in to gloom and despair. On the First Sunday of Advent, we were reminded to wait in Hope. On the Second Sunday, we were reminded to wait in peace. On this Third Sunday of Advent, we wait with hearts full of joy because, the coming of Emmanuel – God is with us – is near at hand.

There are some among us whose situation in life makes it difficult to see any reason to rejoice. One this day, we lift up those who are burdened with any kind of sorrow or sadness, and we ask the Lord to dispel from our hearts the darkness that comes with sorrow and grief. We should remember that Joy is not simply a soft emotion or a momentary burst of happiness; it is the deep disposition of our heart and soul to the comfort of the Lord. This arises from faith and trust in God's promises. Our Christian journey is filled with both challenges and blessings. Our modern society is afflicted with radical individualism and widespread pessimism. As a result, many people experience severe depression, anxiety, and loss of hope. However, true Christian joy persists even in hardship because it is rooted in the unchanging presence and faithfulness of God. When we allow our hearts to be anchored in God's divine love, joy becomes a sustaining force, carrying us through life's uncertainties and sorrows. Joy is not the absence of pain, hardship, or suffering. Holy joy is the sense of contentment that God is with us and that He will see us through all our troubles.

Like most great spiritual gifts, joy must be practiced. We can deepen joy in our lives by embracing a spirit of gratitude. Saint Paul tells us 'rejoice always. Pray without ceasing. In all circumstances give thanks, for this is the will of God for you in Christ Jesus' (1 Thessalonians 5:16-18). As we continue our journey as disciples of the Lord, not only during this Advent Season, but throughout our lives, may we remain grateful to God for all that we have and are. **Gratitude deepens hope in us and hope fills us with joy.** As we light the rose candle this week, may our hearts be opened to gratitude and joy. May we also share this joy of the Lord with others, reaching out to those in need, offering kindness and encouragement wherever we go.

Rejoice, for the Lord is near!




