THE FAMILY AS DOMESTIC CHURCH

The need for strong Christian families in today's world

Dear brothers and sisters,

as we continue to celebrate the joy of Christmas, I pray that all of you may experience the joy of this Holy Season. On this Sunday after Christmas Day, the Church celebrates the Feast of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph. Since the Second Vatican Council, the church has given much emphasis on **the Family as the Domestic Church, that is a “little Church” where the faith is lived out.** The Feast of the Holy Family of Nazareth invites us to see our own homes as holy ground, where God dwells among us. In our family prayers, we imitate the larger church in worship. In our sacrifices for each other, we imitate the larger church in offering sacrifice to God. In our love for one another and for our neighbors, we imitate the larger church in charity to the world. I am always encouraged by those parents who make great effort to bring up their children in the faith. Despite the challenges of our modern culture, they continue to walk in the ways of the Lord.

The Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph is a true model for us. **God did not spare the Holy Family the pains of family life,** betrayal, death threat, anxiety about their lost child, grief, hunger, and all other sorrows of life. As the Holy Family faced trials and uncertainties with trust in God, so too are we called to anchor our own families firmly in faith. More than ever before, our world needs the witness of good, strong, vibrant, and convinced Christian families. As the great Saint John Paul II said, **when our families are strong, the Church will be strong. When the Church is strong, the world will be strong.** Our families must be places where faith is nurtured and grows.

Dear friends, let us consider three elements of a vibrant Christian Family. First of all, **prayer** must be an important part of our family life. Attend Mass together on Sundays and on Holy Days and even on some weekdays, as your schedule permits. Go to confession together and set aside a space in your homes for prayer. The famous words of the Holy Cross Father Patrick Payton continue to inspire us, **“the family that prays together, stays together.”** United in prayer and service, families will encounter the love and mercy of God and will be able to withstand the pressures and struggles of our world. Secondly, **forgiveness** must be readily given and received. In letter to the Church in Ephesus, Saint Paul says **‘be angry but do not sin; do not let the sun set on your anger, and do not leave room for the devil’** (Ephesians 4:26-27). When we learn to forgive the little offenses, we will have the courage to forgive bigger offenses. If we cannot forgive our loved ones, will we have the strength to forgive our enemies? Thirdly, **learn about your faith** and be willing to share it with others. We cannot love what we do not know. The faith formation of the family deepens their love of Christ. As scripture tells us, **‘sanctify Christ as Lord in your hearts. Always be ready to give an explanation to anyone who asks you for a reason for your hope, but do it with gentleness and reverence, keeping your conscience clear, so that, when you are maligned, those who defame your good conduct in Christ may themselves be put to shame’** (1 Peter 3:15-16).

We bless Your name, O Lord, for sending Your Son to become part of a family, sharing, and experiencing its worries and its joys. We ask You, O Lord, to protect and watch over the families of our parish, so that in the strength of Your grace its members may enjoy prosperity, possess the priceless gift of Your peace, and, as the Church alive in the home, they may bear witness in this world to Your glory.

We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.

We will always accept toiletry and household items such as bodywash, soap, toilet paper, toothpaste, laundry detergent, and dish detergent.

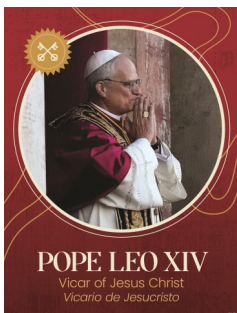
