



"I urge you, brothers and sisters, in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that all of you agree in what you say, and that there be no divisions among you, but that you be united in the same mind and in the same purpose." 1 Cor 1:10

St. Paul writes today to the people of Corinth, who for whatever reason have been arguing with each other. And as much as the argument is good for one place, for example in the philosophy, it is not such a good idea in another place (daily life). People of Corinth argue with each other about faith and who is closer to God. They use as their argument their way of becoming Christians. St. Paul challenges them and reminds them that it is not the person who is important in their salvation and who has brought them to Christ, but it is the Christ in whose name the faith was brought to them. The beauty of Christian faith is that we do not have to relinquish our identity, our talents, our background but we are invited to use those gifts for the greater good and glory of God. Our faith is not about individualistic approach of God but it is a gift that is meant to be shared with those around us. "The body's unity does not do away with the diversity of its members: "In the building up of Christ's Body there is engaged a diversity of members and functions. There is only one Spirit who, according to his own richness and the needs of the ministries, gives his different gifts for the welfare of the Church." The unity of the Mystical Body produces and stimulates charity among the faithful: "From this it follows that if one member suffers anything, all the members suffer with him, and if one member is honored, all the members together rejoice. "Finally, the unity of the Mystical Body triumphs over all human divisions: "For as many of you as were baptized into Christ have put on Christ. There is neither Jew nor Greek, there is neither slave nor free, there is neither male nor female; for you are all one in Christ Jesus." (Catechism of the Catholic Church # 791)

Many of us are looking for a place to belong, to be recognized, to be ensured that what we do is shared by others. The Church provides that opportunity in variety of ways. We are invited to be the members of a great community of believers who aspire to greater spiritual life. As individuals, we are limited by our shortcomings and ability to experience life. As a community, we can share the common good that comes to us both from the physical world as well as from the depth of our spirituality. One thing that we need to remember, in order to rejoice in the Christ, is that we do not proclaim ourselves. We live for Christ and others. If we focus only on ourselves, we will see only as much as we can understand. If we allow others to come in, we will be blessed by the spirit of others and encouraged by their hearts. That means that others will be challenging us, but if they do it in the name of Christ, we need not to worry. After all, Christ, and St. Paul who come in Christ's name want for us only to be united with them in the Heavenly Jerusalem.

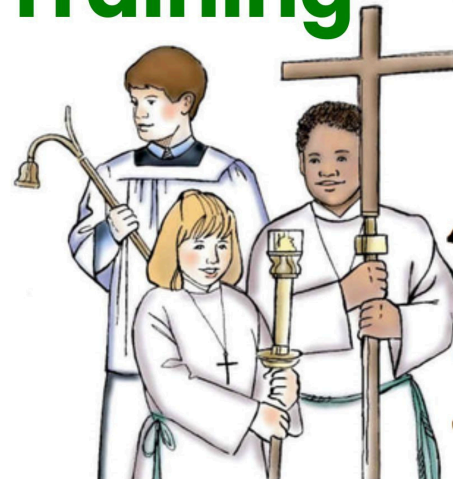
