This Sunday's readings are remarkable in that each one warns us to not be overly attached to earthly things. There is nothing wrong with enjoying the good things that earth provides. They are all gifts from God. Where we run into issues is when we get overly possessive of these gifts thinking that we will somehow have or control them forever. The truth is that we are stewards of everything that God has given us. We will have them for a little while but at some point, we must pass them on. There is an Australian Aboriginal Proverb that sums up this point beautifully that Queen Elizabeth II quoted in 2011 and it goes as follows.

We are all visitors to this time, this place. We are just passing through. Our purpose here is to observe, to learn, to grow, to love.... and then we return home.

Our home is heaven. A place we desire to reside when our earthly lives come to an end. The readings this weekend warn us that if we hold onto the things of earth too much, we risk losing what we truly desire.

In the first reading from Ecclesiastes the word vanity describes things that may seem desirable or important in the moment but ultimately offer no enduring satisfaction or purpose. This includes things like wealth, fame, pleasure, and even wisdom when pursued without a spiritual foundation. In essence life without God, is ultimately meaningless.

Colossians instructs us therefore to put to death all the parts of us that are earthly: immorality, impurity, passion, evil desire and the greed that is idolatry. We are instructed to take off the old self and put on the new self. This conversion of heart is rarely a lightning strike but more often a dedicated perseverance in working towards conforming our hearts to the heart that died to save us. A task that can take a lifetime to achieve.

In the gospel, Jesus reminds that all of our plans can come to end in an instant, so we are challenged to not seek security of life but security of eternal life. Jesus shares the story of a man who is so successful that he decides instead of being generous with his bounty he decides to hoard it but in the end it will dispersed others despite his greedy plans.

A good example of this is how often do we hear stories of how a metal detector hobbyist discovers some hoard of ancient coins or jewelry. The original owner obviously hid them with the intent to come back later and dig them up. Later never came and their trove of riches lay buried until they were rediscovered thousands of years later. The Lord calls us to reflect on how we are living out our lives and to ask the question, am I planning for a future on earth or heaven?

We are the stewards of God's gifts. Let us therefore enjoy and share what he bestows upon us knowing that what we have is ultimately his. In doing so, we can help to bring about peace and justice in the world now as we hope for eternal life with God in Heaven.






