Recently, I was listening to Bishop Bullock's Book Club podcast. In that episode, they were discussing meaning. Fr. Dillon remarked that our meaning is not static. We can choose to find new meaning as the seasons in our lives change.

It reminded me of the state of mind that I was in when I was 34 years old and had a stroke. I confused my worth, with my life's meaning. What I consider to be one of my biggest gifts from God now, was a particularly low place for me as I was going through it. Like the reading today says, "At the time, all discipline seems a cause not for joy but for pain, yet later it brings the peaceful fruit of righteousness to those who are trained by it." HB 12:5-7

Not all days can be happy. But perhaps they can all have meaning, and meaning is an active choice. If you are going through a challenging time, until you discern its meaning, I would like to share with you some of the things that have helped me navigate the in-between.

- 1. Think about others around the world who may be experiencing similar circumstances. And then pray for them. They are your community. You are not alone.
- 2. Consider that the LORD imagined you, and then He created you, and then He willed you into existence, and He RIGHT NOW maintains a thought of you which sustains your existence!
- 3. "Worry is a misuse of imagination"-Unknown. To combat anxiousness, I attempt to imitate the Creator. Do you cook, build, draw, garden, paint? We can cooperate with God to bring something into existence. Go make something!
- 4. "You have already lived through 100% of your worst days".

Fr. Andrzej has reminded me that the stars and their beauty are only visible when it is night. God shares these marvels with us, and we are made aware of how generous God is, and how much He loves us.

1 Peter 2:9 talks to us when it says, "You are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's own people, that you may declare the wonderful deeds of him who called you out of darkness into his marvelous light."

At times in my life, I have felt worth--less during challenges. But in hindsight, they were actually times when I was discerning my purpose. "We know that in everything God works for good with those who love him, who are called according to his purpose." Romans 8:28

In a newsletter from Chris Stefanick, he says "your true "net worth" is God the Son, who gave Himself for you. Amazingly, not even your sins and mistakes can diminish that worth.

A \$25,000 gold brick covered in mud is still worth \$25,000! Wipe it off. Repent. Go to confession. Move on. Then rinse and repeat without ever losing heart. The God who paid for you with His blood isn't giving up on you. Don't give up on yourself."




