Dear Friends in Christ,

In my early years of priesthood as I was learning the ins and outs of the priesthood, I was mesmerized by a few things I observed. I was observing the people's attachment to their special seats in the church. How comfortable they are in one spot and how challenging it is for them to move somewhere else, especially when their seat is taken. But this situation was answered by another incident I observed. From time to time in the collection basket, there was a check with the annotation "pew rent." I was not familiar with this term so I asked for the explanation. It was then I found out that at some point in the life of the local church there was a pew rent collection. Parishioners were asked to help with the expanses by paying for the pew they were sitting in. I now understand how and why some people are so attached to their particular place in the church. They simply have bought the rights for this place. Unknowingly to them and the pastors, this pew rent has created a bit of unfriendly behavior. A behavior that usually was used towards strangers who without the local knowledge of the parish, would sometimes sit in the church in someone's seat. The local parishioners have paid for it so they thought they had rights to it as well. I am sure you have experienced in your lifetime the stern look from someone when you were visiting other churches. Maybe you were just new to them, or perhaps you just took their seat.

Jesus is using this "pew rent" idea to make a point in today's Gospel. He is entering a society where things seemed to be well established and laid out. But that is the local practice. Jesus could be nice and asked for a tutorial before he entered this home, but we know Jesus likes to make waves. He comes and breaks the status quo and invites himself to a Pharisee's house for a dinner. Very quickly Jesus is reminded that is not how the things work locally. But Jesus' response is that perhaps this local way of life is not the best one. It might work for the locals, but what about the visitor, the stranger and others? The Gospel and the teachings of Jesus constantly remind us of the need in our life to be open for new horizons.

New possibilities open up before us in sometimes least expected moments. The Holy Spirit whom we have received at the Baptism and Confirmation is constantly at work. And, yes, sometimes we may find ourselves just comfortable in our own "pew" that we think we have rented from God. But Jesus reminds us, that we still only are renting it and the owner – God – could come at any time and show us another use for it. Therefore, let's keep in mind and make a resolution to be constantly on the lookout for the new possibilities in our journey of Faith and the way God would make Himself known to us.




