This weekend we celebrate Gaudete Sunday which gets this name from the entrance antiphon which in Latin is, "Gaudéte in Dómino semper: íterum dico, gaudéte. Dóminus enim prope est," which is the Latin translation of the title of this bulletin.

The season of Advent is meant to be a time for repentance and reflection, so that we might prepare our hearts and our minds for the coming of Christ. So, in the midst of this penitential season, the call to rejoice brings a welcome break from the otherwise somber mood of Advent. The liturgical color even changes from violet to rose joyfully reminding us that our salvation is near.

Our first reading from Isaiah presents to us a vivid and hopeful prophecy that conveys that God comes to fulfill his promises to heal and make us whole. The second reading encourages us to be patient, prepared and firm in our faith as we await the coming of the Lord. In the Gospel, Jesus is asked by John's disciples, "Are you the one who is to come, or should we look for another?" Jesus answers them by telling them to report to John what they hear and see, then lists all that he has done leaving it up to them discern that he is the Messiah that prophets foretold would come. Gaudete Sunday is the halfway point in the Advent season, and it commands us to prepare for Christ's coming not just with prayer and penance, but with joy.

Each day, the Clergy and many of the Laity pray the Liturgy of the Hours, the daily prayer of the Church, which marks out the hours of each day with structured prayers, psalms, readings, and hymns. It is meant to sanctify the day and all human activity as it invites its participants to remain in constant communion with God throughout the day. During the last seven days of Advent, from December 17th to the 23rd, the "O Antiphons" are sung or recited before and after the Magnificat during Vespers (Evening Prayer). You may not have heard of these antiphons, which are short chants or refrains, but you would recognize them as the verses for the popular Advent hymn "O Come, O Come, Emmanuel." Here is the title of each antiphon.

12/17: O Sapientia (O Wisdom)

12/18: O Adonai (O Lord of Might)

12/19: O Radix Jesse (O Root of Jesse)

12/20: O Clavis David (O Key of David)

12/21: O Oriens (O Day-Spring)

12/22: O Rex Gentium (O King of Nations)

12/23: O Emmanuel (O God with Us)

The first letter of these messianic titles spells out the Latin words ERO CRAS, meaning, "Tomorrow, I will come." I encourage you to take up the practice of praying the Liturgy of the Hours using either a breviary or an app. I know it will help to bring you closer to God in your everyday life and I pray that this Advent season may be a time of refreshing renewal for you and your family as we all await the arrival of our newborn King and his second coming at the end of time.


