The end of Advent is here. Only few more days and we will gather together again to celebrate the birth of Jesus. In many ways, we will rejoice, though for many it will also be a difficult time. As much as we want to be happy, our hearts will also remember many of the events of our life, that make us sad. Christmas is hinting that the end of another year is right around the corner. We just got older and somehow farther away from the perfect life we planned on living. But perhaps, all this reminiscing, our nostalgia, and short lived joy of Christmas is not that bad or that unique. As we read the story of Christs' conception and of his birth, we find that the life of the Emmanuel was not that great either. Be not afraid to take Jesus, and his Holy Family into your homes.


