Jubilation from John

Since one of the disciples uttered those words, volumes upon volumes have been written about prayer—what it is, how to do it, where to pray, why we should pray, types and methods of prayer, what to wear and how to stand, sit or kneel. It's not hard to find something to say on the subject of prayer—it's much harder to decide what not to say. So, take your lead from Jesus—the best source when one is preparing to pray—and invoke the KISS principle. K-I-S-S—Keep It Simple Stupid. When the disciple said, "Lord, teach us to pray," Jesus simply responded with an invocation—Abba, Father—and five simple petitions: (1) hallowed be your name; (2) your kingdom come; (3) give us each day our daily bread; (4) forgive us our sins; and (5) do not subject us to the final test.

Pretty simple—and yet one of the greatest intellectuals of all time, St. Thomas Aquinas, described the Lord's Prayer as "the most perfect of prayers... In it we ask, not only for the things we can rightly desire, but also in the sequence that they should be desired. This prayer not only teaches us to ask for things, but also in what order we should desire them." Simple, yet perfect and so profound.

Not having the intellect of St. Thomas Aquinas, I'm drawn to something even simpler in the Lord's Prayer—the invocation—and what it tells us about prayer. Jesus taught his disciples—as He teaches you and me—to invoke God just as the Son invoked God. He teaches us to call out to God as Abba, Father. This invocation speaks to us of relationship—of a family relationship between children and their father. As Jesus continues teaching his disciples about prayer—"Ask and you will receive; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you" (Lk 11:9)—he comes back to this father-child relationship to reinforce his teaching: "If you then, who are wicked, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will the Father in heaven give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him?" (Lk 11:13)

So, to Keep It Simple, prayer is "a vital and personal relationship with the living and true God" (CCC 2558). Jesus taught us to call God, "Abba, Father," just as through Baptism God calls us, "My beloved son" or "My beloved daughter." I want the kind of vital, personal relationship that Abraham had in this Sunday's reading from the Book of Genesis. Not just talking to God, but talking with God. Not just speaking, but also being silent, intently listening with my heart as well as my ears. Speaking out in humility, yet trusting in His infinite love. Confident I can share anything with Him and He won't abandon me.

I don't think we develop an intimate relationship with God by just attending church once a week or even having a quiet time every day. A personal relationship with God is built by sharing all our life experiences with Him. God wants to be more than an appointment in our busy schedules. He wants to be included in every activity, every conversation, every problem, and even every thought on our busy schedules. He is Abba, Father—surrounding us with a life-giving presence, sustaining us by an infinite tenderness, transforming the ordinary into the eternal.



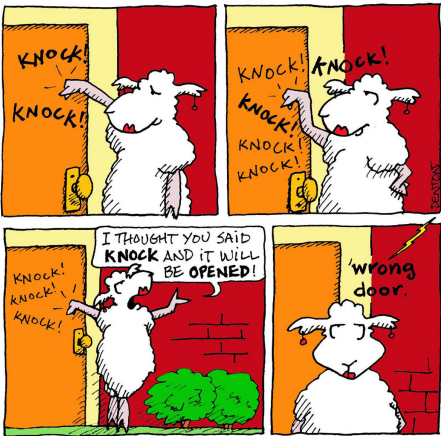

Seventeenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Gn 18:20-32 | Col 2:12-14 | Lk 11:1-13

GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

“Ask and you will receive; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you.” Sounds lovely, doesn’t it? I remember understanding this verse as though God is like a genie in a bottle and prayer is like a delivery service. But when I encountered true hardship, this interpretation was tested. I was seeking, but I couldn’t find what I wanted. My request seemed to go unanswered. I was asking, but my hands were empty. I couldn’t reconcile this. Did this mean God wasn’t telling me the truth? Trusting that couldn’t be the case, I pressed in a little harder. In time, and through the grace of God, I realized I’d been reading this verse through selfish eyes. I was understanding this passage to say, “ask for whatever you feel like in the moment, and I’ll drop it on your doorstep.” But what does Jesus *actually* say? He says that if we ask, he will always give us *the Holy Spirit*. This understanding can change how we pray. The Lord doesn’t promise to instantly cure our maladies, or to remove every ounce of pain on this side of the veil. But he does promise to send his Advocate, the Holy Spirit, to be with us through it all. And that is far better than any type of delivery service.

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

Today’s psalm echoes the Gospel message that the Lord never abandons us. In our response, we unite our voices with the universal Church as we say, “Lord, on the day I called for help, you answered me.” We encounter hardship on a daily basis. From the tiny irritations that tempt our tempers to flare to the heavy crosses we carry, we are reminded of how much we need God’s help. And yet, how often is our response to turn inward and grow weary, discouraged, or angry? Next time we come eye to eye with a challenge, let’s try to respond like the psalmist, and cry out to the Advocate. He is very near. *Come Holy Spirit.*

REFLECT

We are reminded in today’s readings that the Lord is always near, that he hears us, and that he responds generously. Thank God this is true even when it doesn’t seem like it. As we face our daily hardships, let’s not forget to ask Jesus for help. Don’t forget that he never rations the Spirit, and though he will never force himself on you, he’s waiting eagerly to pour his love into your heart. Ask! Seek! Knock! He knows your voice, and he is ready to respond.
