It is none other than Saint Maria Goretti whose feast day is July 6th. She is also the patron saint of young people, chastity, victims of rape, and forgiveness. Maria Goretti was born October 16,1890 in Corinaldo, Italy. She was the third of seven children in a poor farming family. Her father, Luigi, instilled in her a deep love for God and the Catholic church. Luigi tragically died from malaria when Maria was 9 years old. Despite the hardship, Maria's faith remained strong. She took on the household duties, caring for her younger siblings while her mother, Assunta, and brother worked in the fields. Maria impressed everyone with her radiant purity. She was naturally pious, kind, and helpful. She grew in grace, beauty and maturity, and her cheerful obedience and piety were noticed by those around her.

On July 5, 1902, a neighboring farm hand, Alessandro Serenelli, tried to rape Maria. On several prior occasions, Alessandro had harassed Maria with impure advances, all of which she vehemently rejected. This time he locked her in a room and tried to force himself upon her. She fought against him, shouting, "No! It is a sin! God does not want it!" and warning him that this was the path towards hell. When Maria declared that she would rather die than submit to this sin, Alessandro angrily grabbed her and stabbed her 14 times with a knife. Maria was found bleeding to death and rushed to the hospital. As she lay dying, she forgave Allessandro for the crime he committed against her, saying, "Yes, for the love of Jesus I forgive him."

Allesandro was sentence to 30 years in prison. He remained unrepentant until one night, eight years into his prison term, Maria appeared to him, dressed in white, gathering lilies in a garden. She smiled, turned towards Allessandro, and offered him the flowers. From that moment on Allessandro converted and found peace. He repented his crime and changed his life. When he was released, he begged forgiveness from Maria's mother which she granted. Allessandro then lived out the rest of his life in a Capuchin monastery.

Pope John Paul II said on her feast day in 2003, What does this fragile but Christianly mature girl say to today's young people, through her life and above all through her heroic death? Maria Goretti, provides us with a witness of what it means to be "pure of heart" and to "forgive." Maria reminds us that true happiness demands courage and a spirit of sacrifice, refusing every compromise with evil and having the disposition to remain, even to death, faithful to God and his commandments. How timely this message is. Today, pleasure, selfishness and direct immoral actions are often exalted in the name of the false ideals of liberty and happiness. It is essential to reaffirm clearly that purity of heart and body go together, because chastity is the custodian of authentic love." Purity of heart, as with every virtue, requires a daily discipline of the will and a constant interior discipline. Above all, it calls for assiduous recourse to God in prayer.







#### A Safe Environment for Children and Young People





# Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Is 66:10-14c | Gal 6:14-18 | Lk 10:1-12, 17-20

GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

Our calling as disciples of Christ is to evangelize. To be honest, it's something many of us aren't entirely comfortable with. Anyone who has ever felt ill-equipped to share the faith with family or friends should be reassured by today's Gospel. Jesus' early followers probably felt unprepared to share the news that the kingdom of God was at hand - and they received their marching orders from Jesus himself! When Jesus sent the seventy-two out to proclaim his coming, he knew they would feel insecure. He sent them without money, sandals, or even a sack for travel, and told them they would be lambs among wolves. How nervous they must have been given that ominous warning! Still, they believed they would have what they needed. Sure enough, their work was successful. They rejoiced because they could cast out demons in his name - something they never imagined was possible. They turned hearts to Christ because they trusted and obeyed him.

#### **GO EVANGELIZE**

#### PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

When it comes to sharing our faith with the people God puts in our lives, we're asked to do the same as the seventy-two: Obey Jesus' command to go out and proclaim his kingdom and trust we will have what we need. It isn't necessary to rehearse our testimony. We don't need to memorize the Scriptures or cite chapter and verse. An advanced degree in theology isn't required. What is needed? Ears for listening and the patience to act. Listen closely for the person who says they're afraid or alone, confused or hurting. Listen with compassion to the person who feels abandoned by God. Listen with an open heart to the person who shares doubts or disappointments. Wait for an opening in the conversation to remind him or her that God loves them through every struggle. And share your faith through the power of prayer.

## PRAY

This week, find that someone in your life who may be hurting for whatever reason. Tell them you will pray *for* them and offer to pray *with* them. Prayer and compassion are our marching orders, and we can follow them by trusting Jesus is right there with us when we need him.
