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## **II.** Challenges from enrollment / attendance:

- Regulars are not enrolling even after multiple requests
- Sickness this Fall is consistently knocking out about three students each class for Confirmation and one or two students each meeting for the YDisciple groups.

## III. Evaluating how we are meeting Commission Goals for 2024-2025:

- 1. The Rescue Project
  - Offer at least two opportunities for The Rescue Project for the 2024-2025 year. I would like to see at least three small group leaders come out of the first group; however, I also would like to see people in the other roles (hospitality, prayer team, food, etc.) as well.

There are two opportunities for the Rescue Project this Fall and three participants have returned from the first round. Pamela Weaver, Richard Long, and Jane Fortsch have returned to help lead. Kim Wynn also offered help and has brought her husband this time around. The joint retreat is this weekend.

#### 2. CGS atrium

- Complete Joan of Arc classroom Assess and work toward fulfillment of the needs of our halffinished Level II CGS atrium, St Joan of Arc, having it fully self-sufficient by the end of the 2024-25 school year.
- Recruiting Catechists Recruit and train one more level III CGS catechist in 2025. This is Mary's domain.

#### 3. Group reunions

o Identify which groups in OLBH would be interested in a reunion: Sacrament recipients, ChristLife participants, RCIA, First Communion, CGS "graduates", etc., and organize and schedule the reunions.

**Baptism, First Reconciliation, and First Communion recipients:** I'm coordinating a Jesse Tree craft day on Sunday, December 1 for the parish that especially welcomes those families with children who have received Baptism & First Sacraments within the past couple years. (Calling it a reunion will mean nothing to Baptism parents who have not met each other, so it will not be marketed that way. "Reunion" applies more for the first sacrament parents, so that verbiage will be used.)

**RCIA:** I will coordinate another Pentecost Party for the parish that especially welcomes those who have ever joined the Catholic church on the Easter Vigil

**Confirmation recipients**: I will invite recently Confirmed students to be an active part of the Confirmation retreat in February. I will also encourage all 8-12<sup>th</sup> grade students to attend the Confirmation Mass. At this point, most of all Confirmed students are continuing to be active in their faith formation and proceed with YD, Catholic school, and/or as assistant catechists.

# **CGS Catechists**

## Goals

Previous Goal: 1-2 more L2 catechists

-CGS II Training began at Blessed Sacrament in April/May, with the second half in September/October. We had 5 catechists complete level 2 training, with 1 auditing.

Current Goal: 1-2 more L3 catechists, 1-2 more L1 catechists

- -CGS 3 training will be 2025-26, however it is quite intensive and requires a huge time commitment, currently have 2 registered for L3 training.
- -Complete St Joan of Arc (L2 atrium), coming along but is a big task. Seeking help from those with talents in our parish to share.

#### New Goal:

-Find 1-2 new catechists for L1 training (2025 in Rapid City, 2 parishioners interested)

## **Going well**

Currently 7-ish weeks in. Continued arrangement of dual formation times on Wednesday seems to be working well. Added hall monitors on Wednesday (both sessions), no more wandering kids during class. Atria are running well with great groups of kids.

## **Challenges**

Still need CGS assistants (primarily), have struggled to find help this year. Difficult time finding subs especially. Poor parking lot lighting (working on that) parents are doing better coming in to get kids this year. Water fountain non-functional, being replaced.

- -Completion of St Joan for full use as L2 atrium
