2021 Com munity Impact Dashboard

Through the hard work of our staff, partner agencies and community partners, together we fed 479,085 households and 1,259,175 individuals, some more than once. (229.52% Increase in total households served and a 162.82% increase in total individuals served over 2020). We distributed more than 14 million pounds of food and provided 11.3 million meals in 2021.
