PHASE 1: 20 DAYS OF PRAYER AND DANIEL FAST



LENTEN FOCUS: 20 Days of Prayer and Consecration

Day 1 - We pray for the presence of the Spirit that the Holy Spirit will return, revive, refresh, restore, renew the Church.

Day 2 - We pray for our Pastor

We pray that fresh anointing, a spirit of wisdom, revelation and knowledge be given to the Pastor and that vision will be clear.

Day 3 - We pray for our church.

For a corporate anointing, a spirit of unity and a commitment to living the Christ life. We lift the work, witness and worship of the church before the Lord.

Day 4 - We pray for workers.

Jesus said the harvest is great, but the laborers are few, therefore pray to the Lord of the harvest they He will send forth workers.

We pray that God sends, raises up and releases workers.

We pray that God send those who have a mind to work and the gifts, skills and abilities to do the work.

Day 5 - We pray for the world.

There is conflict, strife, confusion everywhere. We pray for the people of the world, we pray for the peace of the world, we pray for the healing of the land.

Day 6 - We pray for the lost.

Billions of people are lost and without Christ in their lives. We pray for an end time harvest of souls. We pray for missionaries, gospel workers, evangelists and for the saints to be witnesses who share their faith.

Day 7 - We pray for the sick and suffering.

Here in America and around the world, there are many who suffer from poverty, sickness/disease. We pray for healing and that God sends help, relief and that we be willing to be an answer to this prayer.

Day 8 - We pray for our children.

Our children are our future and many do not know Christ and many are in situations that are not healthy or safe. We pray for the protection of our children, the salvation of our children and the good success of our children.

Day 9 - We pray for our Elders, the seniors among us.

Growing older is a gift and blessing and yet there are also challenges and changes that come with it. We pray that our Elders are honored and respected. We pray that they are safe and that their needs are met. We pray that they live with the assurance of their salvation and that if they are not saved, they will come to know Christ.

Day 10 - We pray for families.

Families are the foundation and bedrock of the society and the Church and yet in so many ways, the family is under attack. We pray for families, for their harmony and unity, for their love and for the needs families have to be met.

Day 11 - We pray for our military, for first responders and those who serve and sacrifice to protect and care for us.

These men and women have families, they have dreams and they want to go home to their loved ones. We pray for their safety and for their families to have and know peace while they are at work or away.

Day 12 - We pray for those in the academy/schools.

For teachers, administrators, workers.

Day 13 - We pray for those in the medical field.

Doctors, Nurses, researchers, scientists, hospital staff.

Day 14 - We pray for those in the legal profession/the justice system judges, attorneys, court personnel and staff.

Day 15 - We pray for business owners and corporate leaders.

We pray that those who own and lead businesses will be person of integrity, that workers will be respected and compensated. We pray for safe working conditions and for opportunities for growth and promotion.

Day 16 - We pray for the Church Universal

We realize and recognize that the Church is larger than any denomination, even the one we belong to and so we pray for the Church everywhere. We lift our brothers and sister around the world and pray that the Church will shine as light in this world.

Day 17 - We pray for the unity of the Church.

In John 17:6-26 our Lord prays a great prayer of intercession for the Church and at its heart is a plea and prayer for unity. Today we pray that the divisions and differences that fracture the fellowship of the Church, be overcome by a spirit of love and unity, respect and appreciation. That what binds us and unites be stronger than anything that may seek to separate us.

Day 18 - We pray for church leaders.

Paul in Ephesians list what is commonly called "the fivefold ministry gifts" These gifts are given for the equipping and nurturing of the saints, the believers, so that they in turn might do the work of ministry. We lift leaders of denominations, reformations, fellowships and local

congregations, that they will lead with excellence, integrity and humility.

Day 19 - We pray for world leaders.

Paul in 1 Timothy 2 says that we are to pray for those in authority, that we may "lead a quiet and peaceable life" We lift the leaders of the world and pray that they lead with courage, compassion and a consciousness of their accountability to God.

Day 20 - We pray for protection.

Our world is a violent place and everyday we hear of violence, murder, abuse, crime. Today we pray for the protection of people everywhere, especially the most vulnerable, the sick, those battling mental and emotional distress, children and the weak.
