IN MEMORIAM

In May of this year OEA and Funeral Service lost their biggest cheerleader. The Ohio Embalmers Association announces the unexpected passing of member Todd Wesley Van Beck on Tuesday May 23 at his residence in Cincinnati.

His career in funeral service began in Hancock, Iowa and later led him to the New England Institute of Embalming and Sanitary Science in Boston. In addition to funeral service Todd had formal theological training and holds a Masters Degree from Mount St. Mary's Seminary in Cincinnati, Batchelor's Degree from Mount Mercy University, Cedar Rapids, Iowa, and an Honorary Doctorate in Humane Letters from Commonwealth Institute of Funeral Service, Houston, Texas

For a number of decades Todd was a practitioner and educator in the funeral service profession. A noted historian of the industry he has been described by CCMS President Jack Lechner, Jr. as, "the preeminent historian of the deathcare profession." Noted amongst his numerous seminars was his presentation on the death and funeral of President Abraham Lincoln. Todd was the author of over 65 books and manuals and 300 articles on historical diverse funeral service topics of interest to funeral directors, cemeterians and clergy—he has chronicled funeral establishments such as Frank Campbell in NYC and the centennial history of the Cincinnati College. His stories of his early lowa experiences as an apprentice have flavored his seminars and writings.

Over the years he was affiliated with a number of mortuary colleges most recently he was director of continuing education at John A. Gupton College in Nashville, Tennessee. In August of 2022 he again joined the faculty of The Cincinnati College as director of professional education.

Todd was affiliated with many state, national and international funeral associations. He has lectured extensively in New Zealand, the United Kingdom and Germany. For several years Todd was associated with the continuing education University of the International Cemetery, Cremation and Funeral Association.

In the field of embalming most recently he lectured at CCMS on the preparation of infants at CCMS. He was a contributor to the text Embalming: History Theory and Practice. He was a frequent presenter over the years to the Ohio Embalmers – he last spoke at the meeting at the Buffalo Trace Distillery on September 7,2022 on the topic of "Barnes Neo Cardinal Gas Embalming Method."

MEET THE SPEAKERS

C. Jeff Lee, D.O., is currently the Chief Forensic Pathologist Licking County Coroner's Office. He earned a BS in Chemistry from the Ohio State University in 1987 and Doctor of Osteopathy from Ohio University, Athens OH in 1992. From 1992-93 Lee served a Rotating Osteopathic Internship in Flint MI. From 1993-97 Dr Lee served an Anatomic/ Clinical Pathology Residency at William Bauemont Hospital in Royal Oak MI. In 1998 Dr Lee completed his Forensic Pathology Fellowship at the Medical University of Carolina, Charleston, SC. He was the Assistant Chief Medical Examiner, Central District of Richmond, VA from 1998-2000. Dr Lee is the author several Publications and Lectures, and is involved in several Medical Societies

David W. Tackett, M. Div., CFSP

David first became interested in funeral service as a teenager growing up in rural central Pennsylvania in the 1970s. After a brief stint in the Navy Reserves and upon graduation from Penn State University with a Bachelor of Science degree in Criminal Justice, he worked in corrections. David then answered a call to ministry and graduated from United Theological Seminary in Dayton in 1987 with a Master of Divinity degree. He was often called upon to conduct services for families with no pastor and has officiated over 1,000 funeral/memorial services. He remains an ordained Elder in the United Methodist Church. The call to funeral service was always present and David attended CCMS, graduating in 1994 summa cum laude. He apprenticed and worked as an Ohio dual licensee for Routsong Funeral Home in Kettering, Ohio.

David was invited to join the faculty of CCMS in 1996. He taught in the clinical lab as well as various business, religion, ethics, embalming and legal courses. In 2000, he was appointed Dean of CCMS and held that position until 2012.

Since leaving the college, David has done trade embalming and directing and has worked for several Dayton area funeral homes.

In the late Spring of 2023 David returned to the ministry serving as a part-time Pastor at Normandy Church in Centerville.

David has written articles for The Director and the American Funeral Director magazines. He authored a chapter in the Funeral Directing and Funeral Service Management textbook used in mortuary colleges nationwide. He has presented numerous con-ed programs at the local, state, and national level. He is a Certified Funeral Service Practitioner, a Certified Funeral Celebrant and a certified crematory operator. David is, or has been, a member of NFDA, OFDA, OEA, APFSP, ICCFA and the British Institute of Embalmers.

David lives in Kettering, Ohio with his wife and a spoiled Cavalier King Charles Spaniel. He has 2 grown children and three grandchildren.

Dr. Tyler O'Brien, Ed.D., M.A.

Dr. Tyler J. O'Brien is an author, catechist, educator, and funeral service professional. He is a Certified Funeral Service Practitioner through the Academy of Professional Funeral Service Practitioners and a Certified Cremation Service Provider through the National Funeral Directors Association; he is licensed in Indiana, Kentucky, Michigan, and Ohio. Dr. O'Brien earned an Associate of Applied Sciences and a Bachelor of Mortuary Sciences from the Cincinnati College of Mortuary Science. He earned a Master of Arts in Theology from Lourdes University and later a Doctor of Education from the University of the Cumberlands. His experiences include an internship with the University of Cincinnati College of Medicine Anatomical Donation Program, trade funeral director and embalmer, and as an educator and administrator within the public school setting and as a NASA educational partner. He is a funeral director and embalmer for a funeral home in northwest Ohio. Dr. O'Brien has served in various leadership roles and committees on Christian education and faith formation programs within the Roman Catholic Archdiocese of Detroit and is the Director of Religious Education at the parish level.

Scott Janssen, 62, the "Mushin Mortician", was born and raised in Crookston, Minnesota. He graduated from the University of Minnesota in 1985 with a B.S. in Mortuary Science and moved to Alaska in June of that year to work as a mortician at Evergreen Memorial Chapel.
