Psalm Response: On the day I called, you answered me, O Lord

Reflection

Though we be "but dust and ashes," we can presume to draw near and speak boldly to our Lord, as Abraham dares to do in this weekend's First Reading. But even Abraham—the friend of God, our father in the faith, did not know the intimacy that we know as children of Abraham, heirs of the blessings promised to his descendants.

The mystery of prayer, as Jesus reveals to His disciples in the Gospel, is the living relationship of beloved sons and daughters with their heavenly Father. Our prayer is pure gift, made possible by the "good gift" of the Father—the Holy Spirit of His Son. It is the fruit of the New Covenant by which we are made children of God in Christ Jesus (cf. Galatians 4:6–7; Romans 8:15–16). Through the Spirit given to us in Baptism, we can cry to Him as our Father—knowing that when we call, He will answer.

Jesus teaches His disciples to persist in their prayer, as Abraham persisted in begging God's mercy for the innocent of Sodom and Gomorrah. For the sake of the one righteous Man, Jesus, God spared the city of man from destruction, "cancelling the record of debt that stood against us" as Paul says in his Epistle. On the Cross, Jesus bore the guilt of us all. He cancelled the debt we owed to God, the death we deserved to die for our transgressions. We pray as ones who have been visited in our affliction and saved from our enemies, as ones who have been spared.

We pray always a prayer of thanksgiving, which is the literal meaning of "Eucharist." We have realized the promise of this weekend's Psalm: we bow down towards his holy temple, in the presence of angels, exalting His name. In confidence we ask, knowing that we will receive, that He will bring to completion what He has done for us—raising us from the dead, bringing us to everlasting life along with Him.

Enabling our Mission Campaign: Our parish is currently undertaking the Enabling Our Mission Campaign which aims to support our mission of becoming more outward looking, while also striving to ensure that the fewer priests now available for active ministry across the Diocese are best able to serve our communities. The Enabling Our Mission campaign focuses on three key priorities:
- To provide for a Diocesan Mission Enabling Fund which parishes across the diocese

can then apply to for money, which they may not have themselves, in the form of a grant to kickstart a mission project in their parish.

To put in place and resource structures to support the fewer clergy, now just 52 in active ministry across the Diocese, by relieving them of admin and compliance

issues etc. through Deanery hubs for example that will take on this burden. To support parishes directly as 40% of whatever is raised comes back to the parish as part of this campaign so that the parishes themselves benefit directly and immediately from any fundraising (as well as of course being able to apply to the Mission Enabling Fund supported by the fundraising campaign as per above for specific projects).

Foodbank: In particular need at present are: biscuits; treats (crisps, sweets etc.); tins of rice pudding; tinned beans or spaghetti with sausages; tins/jars hot dogs; tinned spaghetti hoops; tinned peas, carrots, potatoes; toothbrushes; deodorant; shower gel.
