# 25<sup>th</sup> / 26<sup>th</sup> October 2025: Thirtieth Sunday of the Year (C)

**Psalm Response:** The lowly one called, and the Lord heard him

#### Reflection

Jesus draws a blunt picture in this weekend's Gospel. The Pharisee's prayer is almost a parody of the thanksgiving psalms (cf. Psalms 30, 118). Instead of praising God for His mighty works, the Pharisee congratulates himself for his own deeds, which he presents to God in some detail. The tax collector stands at a distance, too ashamed even to raise his eyes to God. He prays with a humble and contrite heart (cf. Psalm 51:19). He knows that before God no one is righteous, no one has cause to boast.

We see in the Liturgy then one of Scripture's abiding themes: that with God there 'is no partiality' as the First Reading tells us. God cannot be bribed; we cannot curry favour with Him or impress Him—even with our good deeds or our faithful observance of religious duties such as tithing and fasting.

If we try to exalt ourselves before the Lord, as the Pharisee does, we will be brought low. This should be a warning to us—not to take pride in our piety, not to slip into the self-righteousness of thinking that we're better than others, that we're 'not like other men'. If we clothe ourselves with humility, if we recognize that all of us are sinners in need of His mercy, we will be exalted.

The prayer of the lowly, the humble, pierces the clouds. Paul testifies to this in his Epistle as He thanks the Lord for giving him strength during his imprisonment. Paul tells us what the Psalmist proclaims today — that the Lord redeems the lives of His humble servants.

We too must serve Him willingly. And He will hear us in our distress, deliver us from evil, and bring us safely to His heavenly kingdom.

October Devotion to the Rosary: October is the month traditionally dedicated to Our Lady and the Holy Rosary. I commend this devotion to you as an invitation to experience the grace of Mary's spiritual motherhood as she leads us to her Son, Jesus. The rosary has been an invaluable source of countless spiritual graces for the saints.

Prayers and Offerings for the Holy Souls in November: Available from the back of Church are envelopes for the Holy Souls. If you would like your deceased loved ones remembered at Mass, please take an envelope and then place their names in the envelope provided, together with an appropriate offering, and place in the collection or post through the presbytery letterbox. Thank you.

Blessing of graves: Will take place on Sunday 2nd November at 3:00p.m. at Stamford Cemetery. This is a traditional devotion to help us pray for the souls of our faithful departed. In addition, a plenary indulgence may be gained up until 8th November, applicable to the Holy Souls only, by visiting a cemetery and praying there for the dead (even if only mentally) under the usual conditions: that is Confession, Holy Communion, and prayer for the intentions of the Pope (one 'Our Father', one 'Hail Mary' and one 'Glory be to the Father').

First Holy Communion Programme: Application forms are available now for our First Holy Communion Programme 2025/26, leading to the celebration of First Holy Communion next year. If your child is in Year 3 at school or aged 7 or over and has not yet made their First Holy Communion, then please obtain an application form available at the back of Church. The closing date for registering for the Programme is this Sunday 26th October. Those not attending weekly Mass, at least from the time of application, will not be eligible for the subsequent classes or to make their First Holy Communion, as this is a Diocesan expectation.

**Foodbank:** In particular need at present are: tins of cold meat (e.g. Spam, Ham, corned beef, etc.); tins of vegetarian food (e.g. macaroni cheese); Pot Noodles; dry potato flakes (e.g. Smash); treats (biscuits, crisps, sweets, etc.). Thank you so much for your continued support and generosity.

School admissions to Catholic Secondary Academies (Year 7): For Children born between 01/09/2014 and 31/08 2015 the deadline for submitting your application for a school place is 31st October 2025. Application forms are available on your 'home' Local Authority (LA) website. For every Catholic school you apply for, if you wish your child to be considered and ranked under a faith criterion you should also complete a supplementary information form, and return this form to the school by the deadline, (forms are available from the LA and the school). You must also include the supporting evidence as required with this form, e.g. baptism certificate (photocopies acceptable). Failure to supply the required supporting evidence will mean your child is ranked in a lower criterion which may affect your chance of a place.
