## 1<sup>st</sup> / 2<sup>nd</sup> November 2025: Solemnity of All Saints

**Psalm Response:** Such are the people who seek your face, O Lord

### Reflection

What is the good life which God intends for us and how is it related with the ultimate end or purpose of life? Jesus addresses this question in his sermon on the mount. The heart of Jesus' message is that we can live a truly blessed life now that finds its fulfilment in heaven. The call to holiness, to be saints who joyfully pursue God's will for their lives, can be found in these eight beatitudes. Jesus' beatitudes sum up our calling or vocation – to live a life of the beatitudes. The word beatitude literally means 'blessedness'.

The beatitudes respond to the natural desire for happiness that God has placed in every heart. They teach us the final end to which God calls us, namely the coming of God's kingdom (Matthew 4:17), the vision of God (Matthew 5:8; 1 John 2;1), entering into the joy of the Lord (Matthew 25:21-23) and into his rest (Hebrews 4:7-11). Jesus' beatitudes also confront us with decisive choices concerning the life we pursue here on earth and the use we make of the goods he puts at our disposal. St Theresa of Avila's prayer book contained a bookmark on which she wrote: 'Let nothing disturb you, let nothing frighten you; all things pass: God never changes. Patience achieves all it strives for. Whoever has God lacks nothing, God alone suffices'. Is God enough for you? God offers us the greatest good possible – abundant life in Jesus Christ (John 10:10) and the promise of unending joy and happiness with God. Do you seek the highest good, the total good, which is above all else?

The beatitudes which Jesus offers us are a sign of contradiction to the world's understanding of happiness and joy. How can one possibly find happiness in poverty, hunger, mourning, and persecution? Poverty of spirit finds ample room and joy in possessing God as the greatest treasure possible. Hunger of the spirit seeks nourishment and strength in God's word and Spirit. Sorrow and mourning over wasted life and sin leads to joyful freedom from the burden of guilt and spiritual oppression. God reveals to the humble of heart the true source of abundant life and happiness. Jesus promises his disciples that the joys of heaven will more than compensate for the troubles and hardships they can expect in this world. Thomas Aquinas said: 'No one can live without joy. That is why a person deprived of spiritual joy goes after carnal pleasures'. Do you know the blessedness, the happiness, of hungering and thirsting for God alone?

Blessing of graves: Will take place this Sunday 2nd November at 3:00p.m. at Stamford Cemetery. This is a traditional devotion to help us pray for the souls of our faithful departed. In addition, a plenary indulgence may be gained up until 8th November, applicable to the Holy Souls only, by visiting a cemetery and praying there for the dead (even if only mentally) under the usual conditions: that is Confession, Holy Communion, and prayer for the intentions of the Pope (one 'Our Father', one 'Hail Mary' and one 'Glory be to the Father').

All Souls: Please note that the Commemoration of All Souls is transferred this year to Monday 3rd November - a day in which we are invited to remember and pray for our faithful departed. There will be Mass at 6:00p.m. that day in Stamford, and I will be offering Mass in Oakham as usual at 10:00a.m.

**Parish Youth Group:** Any members of the Parish in secondary school or college are welcome to come along to our Parish Youth Club held on the first Tuesday of every month in the Hall. **SVP Meeting:** The next SVP Meeting will take place this coming Thursday 6th November at 6:00p.m. in the Parish Meeting Room.

**Wajir Collection:** There will be a second collection for Wajir, our Parish mission station, on  $8^{th}$  /  $9^{th}$  November. As always, a massive thank you to all those who contribute to this Mission in a remote and very poor part of Kenya. Sister Beatrice who runs the Mission keeps us all in her prayers and sends regular updates in this time of terrible drought and conflict in the area.

Remembrance Sunday: Next Sunday, 9th November, is Remembrance Sunday when we remember and pray for those who generously gave their lives in service of this country, particularly in the last two World Wars but also in more recent conflicts. Just to remind you that, because of the service at the town war memorial, Broad Street will be cordoned off and therefore it will not be possible to park there. Also, the 11:00a.m. Mass will move to 11:30a.m. to accommodate those who wish to attend the service at the memorial: 'Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them. May they rest in peace. Amen'.

**Veni Emmanuel:** An Advent Meditation of seasonal music and readings by the St Peter's Singers, featuring works by composers from the 16<sup>th</sup> century to the present, will be held here at St Mary & St Augustine Church on Saturday 29th November at 7:30p.m. Entry is free. A retiring collection will be taken, and refreshments available.
