A Tribute to My Mom

My mom was a truly beautiful person who faithfully lived out her vocations as a nurse, wife, mother, and friend. She was a servant of the Lord and a wonderful example of what it means to live a life rooted in faith.

She willingly embraced her role as the mother of a missionary, continuing to encourage me and pray for God's work around the world.

I am profoundly thankful for her life, her faith, and the legacy she leaves behind. She will always remain a part of me and continue to influence who I am today.
