9/4	Can you see God? No, I cannot see God, but he always sees me. John 1:18 “No man hath seen God at any time, the only begotten Son, which is in the bosom of the Father, he hath declared him.”
9/11	Why can we not see God? We cannot see God because He is a spirit and does not have a body. John 4:24 “God is a Spirit: and they that worship him must worship him in spirit and in truth.”
9/18	Does God know all things? Yes, God knows all things. Job 34:21 “For his eyes are upon the ways of man, and he seeth all his goings.”
10/1	Can God do all things? Yes. God can do all His holy will. Matthew 19:26 “But Jesus beheld them, and said unto them, with men this is impossible; but with God all things are possible.”
10/9	What did God make? God made all things. John 1:3 “All things were made by him; and without him was not any thing made that was made.”
10/16	Why ought you to glorify God? I ought to glorify God because He made me and takes care of me. Psalm 146:5-6 “Happy is he that hath the God of Jacob for his help, whose hope is in the LORD his God: Which made heaven, and earth, the sea, and all that therein is: which keepeth truth for ever.”
10/23	How can you glorify God? I can glorify God by loving Him and doing what He commands. Micah 6:8 “He hath shewed thee, O man, what is good; and what doth the LORD require of thee, but to do justly, and to love mercy, and to walk humbly with thy God?”
10/30	How can you learn to love God and obey Him? God Himself and the Bible teach me how to love and obey Him. Joshua 1:8 “This book of the law shall not depart out of thy mouth; but thou shalt meditate therein day and night, that thou mayest observe to do according to all that is written therein: for then thou shalt make thy way prosperous, and then thou shalt have good success.”
11/6	Is God displeased with those who do not love and obey Him? Yes. God is displeased with those who do not love and obey Him. Romans 1:18 “For the wrath of God is revealed from heaven against all ungodliness and unrighteousness of men, who hold the truth in unrighteousness;”

11/13	What were our first parents made of? God made Adam out of the dust of the ground and formed Eve from Adam's body. Genesis 2:7 "And the LORD God formed man of the dust of the ground and breathed into his nostrils the breath of life; and man became a living soul." Genesis 2:22 "And the rib, which the LORD God had taken from man, made he a woman, and brought her unto the man."
11/20	What did God give Adam and Eve besides bodies? God gave Adam and Eve souls that could never die. Ecclesiastes 12:7 Then shall the dust return to the earth as it was: and the spirit shall return unto God who gave it.
12/4	Why did Adam and Eve eat the forbidden fruit ? They ate the forbidden fruit because they did not believe what God has said. Genesis 3:6 "And when the woman saw that the tree was good for food, and that it was pleasant to the eyes, and a tree to be desired to make one wise, she took of the fruit thereof, and did eat, and gave also unto her husband with her; and he did eat."
12/11	What is God's final judgment on unbelievers? All people who do not trust in Christ for salvation deserve the punishment of the lake of fire forever. Revelation 20:14-15 "And death and hell were cast into the lake of fire. This is the second death. And whosoever was not found written in the book of life was cast into the lake of fire."
1/8	Why is Satan not one of God's angels today? Satan became proud, sinned, and tried to fight against God, so God cast him out of heaven. Revelation 12:7, 9 "And there was war in heaven: Michael and his angels fought against the dragon; and the dragon fought and his angels...And the great dragon was cast out, that old serpent, called the Devil, and Satan, which deceiveth the whole world: he was cast out into the earth, and his angels were cast out with him."
1/15	Who can change a sinner's heart? The Holy Spirit can change a sinner's heart. Ezekiel 36:26-27 "A new heart also will I give you, and a new spirit will I put within you: and I will take away the stony heart out of your flesh, and I will give you an heart of flesh. And I will put my spirit within you, and cause you to walk in my statutes, and ye shall keep my judgments, and do them."
1/22	What is grace? Grace is God's kindness to us when we deserve punishment. Ephesians 2:8-9 "For by grace are ye saved through faith; and that not of yourselves: it is the gift of God: Not of works, lest any man should boast."
1/29	What was the work of Christ? The work of Christ was to keep the law of God perfectly and to suffer the penalty for our sin. "For Christ also hath once suffered for sins, the just for the unjust, that he might bring us to God, being put to death in the flesh, but quickened by the Spirit:"
2/5	What is justification? Justification is God's forgiving me and treating me just as if I had never sinned. Romans 8:1 "There is therefore now no condemnation to them which are in Christ Jesus, who walk not after the flesh, but after the Spirit."

2/19	How am I justified? I am justified by faith in the work of Christ. Galatians 2:16 “Knowing that a man is not justified by the works of the law, but by the faith of Jesus Christ, even we have believed in Jesus Christ, that we might be justified by the faith of Christ, and not by the works of the law: for by the works of the law shall no flesh be justified.”
3/26	What is saving faith in Christ? Saving faith is trusting only in Christ’s death and resurrection for salvation. 1 Corinthians 15:1-4 “Moreover, brethren, I declare unto you the gospel which I preached unto you, which also ye have received, and wherein ye stand; By which also ye are saved, ... For I delivered unto you first of all that which I also received, how that Christ died for our sins according to the scriptures; And that he was buried, and that he rose again the third day according to the scriptures:”
3/20	How were people saved before Christ came? People were saved by trusting in the Savior to come. Hebrews 11:13 “These all died in faith, not having received the promises, but having seen them afar off, and were persuaded of them, and embraced them, and confessed that they were strangers and pilgrims on the earth.”
3/4	What is prayer? Prayer is talking to God. Philippians 4:6 “Be careful for nothing; but in every thing by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known unto God.”
3/12	In whose name should we pray? We should pray only in the name of Christ, our intercessor. John 16:23 “And in that day ye shall ask me nothing. Verily, verily, I say unto you, Whatsoever ye shall ask the Father in my name, he will give it you.”
3/19	What does it mean to pray “in Jesus’ ” name? To pray in Jesus’ name is to pray for the same kind of things that Jesus our intercessor is praying for and to pray in the same spirit. 1 John 5:14 “And this is the confidence that we have in him, that, if we ask any thing according to his will, he heareth us:”
3/25	What is sanctification? Sanctification is the process by which God transforms saved people to be like Christ in heart and behavior. Romans 12:1-2 “I beseech you therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, that ye present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable unto God, which is your reasonable service. And be not conformed to this world: but be ye transformed by the renewing of your mind, that ye may prove what is that good, and acceptable, and perfect, will of God.”
4/9	What are the two parts of sanctification? The two parts of sanctification are dying to sin and living in righteousness. Galatians 2:20 “I am crucified with Christ: nevertheless I live; yet not I, but Christ liveth in me: and the life which I now live in the flesh I live by the faith of the Son of God, who loved me, and gave himself for me.”
4/16	What does it mean to believe or have faith in Christ? A person who believes in Christ trusts Him alone for salvation. Acts 16:31 “And they said, Believe on the Lord Jesus Christ, and thou shalt be saved, and thy house.”

4/22	How many commandments did God give on Mt. Sinai? God gave ten commandments on Mt. Sinai. Exodus 34:28 “And he was there with the LORD forty days and forty nights; he did neither eat bread, nor drink water. And he wrote upon the tables the words of the covenant, the ten commandments.”
4/30	What do the first four commandments teach? The first four commandments teach our duty to God. Deuteronomy 6:4-5 “Hear, O Israel: The LORD our God is one LORD: And thou shalt love the LORD thy God with all thine heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy might.”
5/7	What do the last six commandments teach? The last six commandments teach our duty to our fellow men. Leviticus 19:18 “Thou shalt not avenge, nor bear any grudge against the children of thy people, but thou shalt love thy neighbour as thyself: I am the LORD.”
