
"ON THE ROAD" VBS 2025

WASHINGTON UCC SERVICE TRIP

This July, our **JH students** traveled to Cincinnati, to spend a week serving with our friends at **Washington U.C.C**. Our team of **22 students and 9 adults** spent the week serving at various agencies in Greater Cincinnati, assisting with Washington U.C.C.'s summer children program and learning about things like homelessness, the cycle of poverty, gentrification, privilege and more. Our students shared their trip experiences in worship on Sunday, July 27.























SENIOR HIGH EXCURSION

At the end of July, a group of ten graduated high schoool seniors, attended our Senior Excursion in the Allegheny National Forest. This four day adventure includes kayaking, hiking, exploring, campfires and so much more. Our Senior Excursion serves as a capstone experience for our young people and their youth group experience. We spent intentional time discussing the themes of relax, reflect, renew and recharge.

SUMMER BIBLE STUDY

Learning Biblical Hebrew opens the door to reading Scripture in its original language, offering deeper understanding beyond translation.

During our 10-week Summer Bible Study, taught by **Lou Suarez**, students were introduced to Biblical Hebrew. We began by learning the Hebrew alphabet and its sounds, then progressed to forming words, reading sentences, and exploring early Hebrew biblical texts. These passages revealed layers of meaning, poetry, and nuance often lost in translation.

Big thanks to Good Neighbor Thrift Shop for sponsoring the bounce house!










MORTGAGE BURNING CELEBRATION


