Financial donations supported the needs of the church's seven agency partners:



- Haven Center is the only 24/7 homeless shelter for families in Lorain County

- CRS (Community Resource Services) that serves our residents who are suddenly in a need of emergency assistance
- Mercy Resource Mothers in Lorain who support new, single expecting mothers through their pregnancy and their baby's first year

- Road to Hope Margeau's House (female addiction rehab home)
- Genesis House (Lorain County's center for Domestic Abuse)

Empty Bowls by the Lake started in Avon Lake in 2012. Laura Kirchner is the chair person for this charity in Avon Lake. She first attended one of these events in Naples, Florida and thought it would be a good idea

to bring the event to the Cleveland area. In 2012 the event took place in the outdoor area at Bleser Park. After that it moved over to the **Avon Lake United Church of Christ** for several years - held both indoors and outside. It moved over to the American Legion

on Walker Road when it grew too big for the church. In recent years it has been held at the Avon Lake High School Commons on the second or third weekend in October. A \$25 donation gets you unlimited soup, bread and a handmade pottery bowl.

There's always live entertainment and a silent auction as well. 100% of the proceeds benefit the Second

Harvest food bank, the Avon/Avon Lake Community Resource Services (CRS), and Commodore Cupboard, which is part of Lorain County Community College.

The event is run by 100% volunteers and 100% local restaurant soup and bread donations. All of the auction items and bowls are donated. The website for Empty Bowls is emptybowlsbythelake.org



Our annual ALUCC Trunk or Treat was a great success! Despite the cool blustery day we welcomed guests to our church for Halloween fun and fellowship.






































Courageous Conversations
