

### **Prelude**

Andreas Kneller (1649–1724) was a North German organist and composer who worked much of his career in Hamburg and tested new organs in the region; he reviewed J.S. Bach's application for a 1720 organist position in Hamburg before Bach ultimately decided against the position, despite being accepted. Only four or five works by Kneller survive. This prelude is typical of the sectional format of 17<sup>th</sup>-century North German organ works: improvisatory statements open and close the piece while providing relief between structured fugal sections of learned counterpoint.

### **Anthem**

This anthem uses the hymn melody "Ellacombe," a German tune from the late 18<sup>th</sup> century. The first verse begins in choir unison before splitting into parts while the second verse is arranged 'a cappella' in a new key. Finally, the choir returns to the original key while passing the melody back and forth between the upper and lower choir sections.

Hail to the Lord's Anointed, great David's greater Son!
Hail in the time appointed, his reign on earth begun!
He comes to break oppression, to set the captive free; to take away transgression, and rule in equity.

He comes with succor speedy to those who suffer wrong; to help the poor and needy, and bid the weak be strong; to give them songs for sighing, their darkness turn to light, whose souls, condemned and dying, are precious in his sight.

O'er every foe victorious,
He on his throne shall rest,
From age to age more glorious,
All blessing, and all blest.
The tide of time shall never,
his covenant remove.
His name shall stand forever,
that name to us is love.

## Offertory

Frank Treat Southwick (1857–1948) was a New-England organist and composer who began his church music career at age 15. A handful of rather obscure hymns and a few organ pieces survive, including this communion offertory, painting an ethereal mood with chromaticism and shifts into the parallel minor key.

### Postlude

This prelude (a term used to describe North German sectional works broadly, not just literally) is in the relative major key compared to the prelude for the service. After a declamatory introduction, a mischievous fugue ensues and leads into several further sections of improvisational relief and subsequent related fugal passage, a common feature for such works from this region and period.
