One Table, One Body: World Communion Sunday

On the first Sunday of October, Christians across the globe gather for World Communion Sunday. It is a day when the church remembers that we belong not only to a congregation or denomination, but to a worldwide body of believers. Whether bread is baked in a stone oven in Africa, tortillas are broken in Latin America, rice cakes are shared in Asia, or a loaf is passed here in our own sanctuary, the table of Christ stretches wide enough to hold us all.



World Communion Sunday was born out of a vision for unity during times of deep division. It began in the 1930s, when Presbyterian churches in the United States sought to remind themselves and the world that no war, no border, and no cultural difference could sever the bond of love in Christ. Today, it continues to remind us that the church is bigger than our local setting. When we take the bread and share the cup, we declare that Christ is Lord of every nation, every people, and every heart.

In a time when our world feels fragmented—by politics, by race, by wealth, by ideology—the Lord's Table is a radical act of unity. Here, we do not earn a seat by status or merit. We are welcomed not as strangers, but as family and children of God. At the Table, walls fall, differences blur, and grace is the common language spoken.

This year as we celebrate World Communion Sunday, let us come with open hearts, remembering our sisters and brothers who gather in places of danger, scarcity, or joy. Let us pray for peace, justice, and reconciliation. And let us give thanks that in Christ we are one body, sharing one bread, and lifted by one hope.

The Mission Ministry Team allocated \$2,000 to the Congo Leadership Initiative for 2025. OPPC has been sponsoring the organization, co-founded by OPPC college student Nate Houghton in 2010, which has educated and invested in tens of thousands of Congolese youth who have gone on to found hundreds of companies, win elections to public offices and develop innovative strategies to serve their communities.

The team allocated **\$2,500 to the Warm the Children** program through the Rotary Club of Hamburg whose goal is to provide new, warm winter clothing to children of underserved families. OPPC's own Liz Angelbeck is the coordinator of the program and has seen first hand the difference NEW clothing makes in the lives of local kids.





The team rounded out the giving in September by allocating up to \$500 to Churches in Action (CIA) for re-homing cleaning kits which include cleaning supplies, bucket/mod/broom, iron/ironing board etc. Thank you to Meredith and Jim Wilson for shopping and dropping off the kits.

The Mission and Christian Education Ministry Teams are collaborating on signing up 30 people - ages 5 and up! - to participate in the Mobile Pack Event for Feed My Starving Children on Saturday, October 18 from Noon til 2pm.

Last year we had a dozen folks from OPPC head up to The Well in Getzville to be a part of packing nutrient-rich food that is sent around the world to feed hungry kids. We have almost 20 people signed up thus far and are looking to hit that goal of 30 people total. Car pooling will be available from OPPC the day of so if you are interested in attending (do you know that even 5-year-olds can pack these meals?), this is a great opportunity for families to do service together!! Donal Cameron is being raised by his grandmother, the cook at the legendary Double W ranch in Ivan Doig's beloved Two Medicine Country of the Montana Rockies, a landscape that gives full rein to an eleven-year-old's imagination.
