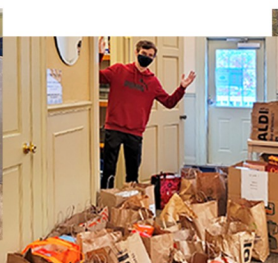
In Volunteers Engaged...

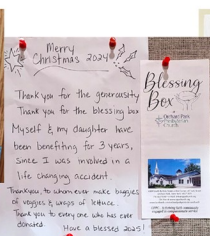
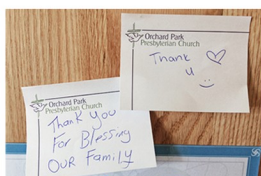
In Donations Collected...

Providing New Winter Clothing for Needy Children



WANTED: VOLUNTEER SHOPPERS!!

Do you enjoy shopping? Would you like to be part of a program that brings joy, warmth and excitement to more than 600 youngsters in need throughout the Southtowns, including those in Orchard Park?

If so, you're invited to become a volunteer shopper for Warm the Children, a program that provides children in need with new, warm winter clothing.

Each fall, Rotary Club of Hamburg sponsors this valuable program, in which parents are teamed with volunteer shoppers, meet at Walmart in Hamburg and select warm jackets, sweaters, boots and other winter clothing for their youngsters. Families in need are referred to the program by school, church or social service staff. **OPPC Mission Ministry Team has provided funds to Warm the Children for the past three years, helping to support more than 60 children within the Orchard Park community.**

Warm the Children coordinator Liz Angelbeck carefully schedules shoppers with families, based on mutual availability, which could be mornings, afternoons, evenings or weekends. Shoppers can choose to volunteer with one family or several. (No cash is exchanged, as an account is set up with Walmart to pay for the selected items.) The program begins in mid-October and runs through December 1.

Shoppers are truly recognized as the "faces of Warm the Children" as they are the ones meeting and greeting our families! **If you'd like to learn more about becoming a volunteer shopper, please contact Liz Angelbeck at lizangelbeck@gmail.com.**

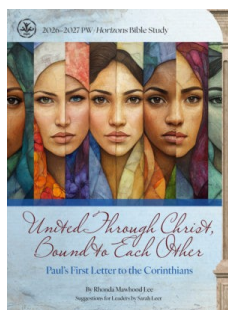

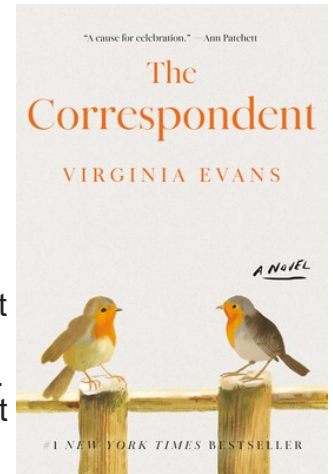
After our summer break, we will read one of the books so many folks are talking about. *The Correspondent* has won many awards and the movie version will star Jane Fonda, who purchased the rights. So what is it about?

Every morning, Sybil Van Antwerp sits at her writing desk to send letters. At age 73, she avoids emails, texts or phone calls. Unbeknownst to her family, her vision is declining, and as she drove home one night, she totaled her car. Worried she might be pressured to live in a retirement home, she keeps quiet and maintains her correspondence with friends, family, and authors whose books she enjoyed. Then there are the unsent letters. Who are they for?

Mother, grandmother, wife, divorcee, and distinguished lawyer, Sybil has led a very full life. A kind neighbor brings her baked goods and she briefly takes in a friend's young son, helping him weather a rough patch. She seeks advice from her brother, her daughter Fiona, and her lifelong friend Rosalie. She travels a bit. However, the transformative power of the written word forces her to examine her life and confront a painful past, finding forgiveness.
