

GRANT SEARCH AND APPLICATION TIPS

Consider project scope: It's important to determine if funding is needed for supplies, professional development, a new program, or an immersive experience like a field trip.

Contact state agencies: State education and arts agencies can provide information on state-specific opportunities and help navigate federal grants.

Review eligibility requirements: Pay close attention to who can apply (teachers, districts, nonprofits) and specific criteria like Title I status or geographical location.

Texas-Specific Grants

Texas Cultural Trust – Arts Inspire Grant:

Supports artist visits, **field trips**, and arts experiences for Title I schools. Up to \$1,000. TEA-certified arts teachers at Title I schools may apply.

• Texas Cultural Trust - First Year Teacher Grant:

Support highly qualified arts teachers in providing quality arts education access to Title 1, rural, low arts access communities. One-time grant of \$1,500. These grants can fund professional development, classroom enrichment, school supplies, **field trips** and additional resources to enhance the quality of arts education.

National & Foundation Grants

NEA Foundation – Student Success Grants:

Supports innovative classroom projects (arts, project-based learning, access programs). Up to \$5,000.
