The following 2021 – 2022 Student Catalog modifications remain applicable to Students enrolled and issued 2021– 2022 & 2022 - 2023 LPN Student Catalogs as stated:

<p><u>REQUIREMENTS FOR GRADUATION & CERTIFICATE AWARD PRESENTATION</u> Students must complete all required 1180 Clock Hours with at least a C grade (77.5% = 78%) in all courses. They will receive at the end of the final course PN300 Role Synthesis (RS) the ATI proctored Comprehensive exam, also known as the national standardized exit exam (NSEE). The student must achieve a minimum satisfactory score (currently 76%) equaling to a 96% (this score is subject to change as indicated by ATI) probability success rate for the NCLEX-PN exam.</p> <p>The NSEE exam is worth 30% of the Role Synthesis 100% Course grade. The student will have two (2) opportunities to take the exam. On the first successful attempt, the maximal percentage of 30% is awarded and on the second attempt the minimal percentage of 15% is awarded.</p> <p>If both exams are failed the student will lose the entire percentage required and will receive a zero (0). In this case, the maximal percentage that is possible for the student to earn for the RS course would be 70%. Therefore, the student will have failed the RS course and will have to repeat the RS course, if eligible.</p> <p><u>Financial information</u> 4. NCLEX Sign-off: Students who have completed all academic requirements for issuance of Certificates of Completion but have not met the financial requirements will have 6 months from date of graduation to meet the financial obligation and receive certifications. After the 6-month period, the student will be required to successfully complete a NCLEX-PN review course as approved by CAAN Academy before the student will be eligible for receipt of the Program Completion Certificate.</p>	<p><u>REQUIREMENTS FOR GRADUATION & CERTIFICATE AWARD PRESENTATION</u> Students must complete all required 1180 Clock Hours with at least a C grade (77.5% = 78%) in all courses. The student must achieve a minimum satisfactory score (currently 78%) equaling to a 97% (this score is subject to change as indicated by ATI) probability success rate for the NCLEX-PN exam</p> <p>The NSEE exam is worth 30% of the Role Synthesis 100% Course grade. The student will have two (2) opportunities to take the exam. On the first successful attempt, the maximal percentage of 30% is awarded and on the second attempt the minimal percentage of 15% is awarded.</p> <p>If both exams are failed the student will lose the entire percentage required and will receive a zero (0). In this case, the maximal percentage that is possible for the student to earn for the RS course would be 70%. Therefore, the student will have failed the RS course and will have to repeat the RS course, if eligible.</p> <p>The following additions to the requirements for graduation is as follows:</p> <p><u>Program/NCLEX Sign-Off:</u> A student who has successfully met all academic and financial obligations at the end of the final nursing course, PN300 – Role Synthesis, will be eligible to complete program sign-off for the NCLEX-PN exam.</p> <p>The NCLEX sign-off process will be conducted with the program director and must be</p>

	<p>completed within 15 days of PN300 course completion.</p> <p>Failure to complete this process within this time frame will result in the student having to retake the end of course ATI proctored Comprehensive exam prior to NCLEX sign-off.</p> <p>Any student who has not completed course assignments by the end of the course must adhere to the following guidelines:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Academics: Students who have not successfully completed Overall Course Criteria i.e., Examinations, Clinical, assignments etc., Will Receive Grading of I = Incomplete / Please see LPN Student Catalog pg. 14. The student will then have 15 days to complete and submit all outstanding assignments and will have to retake the ATI proctored ➤ Financial: A student who has completed all academic requirements for issuance of Certificate of Completion for Practical Nursing and is eligible for NCLEX-PN sign off but has not met financial requirements will have 6 months from date of graduation to meet the financial obligations and will be required to retake and pass the ATI proctored Comprehensive exam. After the 6-month period, the student will be required to successfully complete the program's NCLEX-PN review course, PN300 Role Synthesis, to be eligible for receipt of program signoff for NCLEX-PN and award of Certificate of Completion.
<p><u>Pharmacology/IV Certificate Criteria</u></p> <p>Students must complete the Pharmacology theory and clinical requirements. This process is initiated in FON theory, skills labs, and clinical settings continuing throughout each course of the program. Starting with the administration of Intravenous piggyback medications along with continuous demonstrations of Intravenous Venipuncture (IV) skills. After 10 practice sticks are successfully performed one live venipuncture stick is required under the direct supervision</p>	<p><u>Pharmacology/IV Certificate Criteria</u></p> <p>Students must complete the Pharmacology theory and clinical requirements. This process is initiated in FON theory, skills labs, and clinical settings continuing throughout each course of the program. Starting with the administration of Intravenous piggyback medications along with continuous demonstrations of Intravenous Venipuncture (IV) skills. After 10 practice sticks: Two (2) on the mannequin and eight (8) Live Sticks are successfully performed, one</p>

of qualified faculty. The student sits for the ATI comprehensive proctored pharmacology exam which may be taken a total of 2 times. After successfully achieving a benchmark score of > 70% (this score is subject to change as indicated by ATI) students are then eligible to receive a Pharmacology Certificate. If Pharmacology ATI is not passed in 2 attempts, the student will then have failed the Pharmacology component and will be ineligible to receive the PN Certificate of completion which requires Pharmacology certification. Students will be offered the chance to retake the Role Synthesis (RS) Course at CAAN or the Pharmacology course at the institution of their choice. After completion of the course student then will submit a transcript to retake a 3rd ATI Pharmacology Comprehensive examination with the required benchmark of 70% (this score is subject to change as indicated by ATI). On receiving the PN and Pharmacology certificates the student is then eligible to sit for the NCLEX-PN exam for licensure as a Licensed Practical Nurse (LPN).

additional live venipuncture stick is required under the direct supervision of qualified faculty. On completion of this process, the student is then eligible to sit for the ATI comprehensive proctored pharmacology exam which may be taken a total of two (2) times. After successfully achieving the benchmark score > 73.6% (this score is subject to change as indicated by ATI) students are then eligible to receive a Pharmacology Certificate. If Pharmacology ATI is not passed in two (2) attempts, the student will then have failed the Pharmacology component and will be ineligible to receive the PN Certificate of completion which requires Pharmacology certification. Students will be offered the chance to retake the Role Synthesis (RS) Course at CAAN or the Pharmacology course at the institution of their choice. After completion of the course, the student then will submit a transcript to retake a 3rd ATI Pharmacology Comprehensive examination with the required benchmark of 73.6% (this score is subject to change as indicated by ATI). On receiving the PN and Pharmacology certificates the student is then eligible to sit for the NCLEX-PN exam for licensure as a Licensed Practical Nurse (LPN).

PDO Attendance

Students sign up to attend their desired PDO/event. Students must submit an Essay no later than 7 days after the PDO to receive credit for attendance. The essay rubric is available in the course folder. Once the student signs up for the PDO, the student will be considered scheduled for the event; failure to attend (No Show) a scheduled PDO event will result in a (0) zero grade for participation. Students who arrive late to the scheduled PDO and/or events will receive a 2% deduction of the course participation grade.
