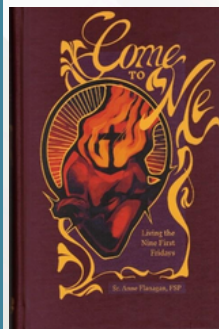

Mary the Mother of God, our Mother of Hope

Mary has many titles. As my oldest granddaughter would say, Mary has a “gazillion titles” or so it seems. On January 1st, we honor her righteous title as Mother of God (Theotokos, meaning “God-bearer”). We know this title well as it is the oldest known title of Mary in the Church (since approximately 250 AD).

Mary holds a unique and irreplaceable place in the mystery of salvation. As the **Mother of God** (Theotókos), she is not only the mother of Jesus Christ -- true God and true man -- but also our spiritual mother, guiding us toward the fullness of hope in Christ. The Catechism of the Catholic Church affirms this profound truth, showing how Mary’s role is inseparably linked to our faith, hope, and salvation.

From the moment of the Annunciation, Mary’s “yes” to God (Luke 1:38) became the doorway through which the Savior entered the world. The Catechism teaches that “Mary is truly ‘Mother of God’ since she is the mother of the eternal Son of God made man” (CCC 495). This title is not merely honorary but expresses the reality that the One she bore is the divine Word made flesh. In her, heaven and earth meet.

But Mary’s motherhood extends beyond Bethlehem. At the foot of the Cross, Jesus entrusted her to the beloved disciple saying, “Behold, your mother” (John 19:27). The Church understands this moment as the gift of Mary to all believers. The Catechism explains that “Mary’s motherhood in the order of grace continues uninterrupted... until the eternal fulfillment of all the elect” (CCC 969). This is why she is also called **Mother of Hope** -- because she accompanies us on our pilgrimage toward eternal life.

Hope, in the Christian sense, is not mere optimism; it is the confident expectation of God’s promises. Mary embodies this hope perfectly. She believed the angel’s word before seeing its fulfillment. She trusted God’s plan even when it led her to Calvary. Her life is a living commentary on the Catechism’s teaching that “hope is the confident expectation of divine blessing and the beatific vision of God” (CCC 2090). Which brings me to my reason for highlighting Mary as the Mother of Hope.

As a parent of three adult children (lapsed Catholics) who are not quite as zealous for the faith as Beth (my wife) and I, we turn to Mary seeking her aid. We place our trust in Jesus through the intercession of his Blessed Mother in times when it seems hope seems silent. Mary’s example reminds us that hope is sustained by faith and nourished by love.

Mary’s role as Mother of God and Mother of Hope is not passive. She actively intercedes for us, leading us closer to her Son. The Catechism emphasizes that her maternal intercession “continues to bring us the gifts of eternal salvation” (CCC 969). Just as she once carried Christ into the world, she now carries our prayers to Him, encouraging us to persevere in hope until we see Him face to face.

In contemplating Mary, we see the perfect disciple --the one who listens, believes, and acts in trust. Her life invites us to entrust ourselves to God’s will, confident that He will bring all things to completion. As Mother of God, she gave us the Savior; as Mother of Hope, she walks with us until we are united with Him forever.



THE 12 DAYS OF CHRISTMAS

begin on Christmas Day and last until the Feast of the Epiphany.

This period is a time of celebration and reflection on the birth of Christ and the revelation of Jesus to the Gentiles, represented by the visit of the Magi. In the Catholic Church, this season is known as Christmastide, which emphasizes joy and festivity following the Advent season of preparation.

The well-known song "The Twelve Days of Christmas" has roots in Catholic tradition, particularly during a time when Catholics in England faced persecution and were prohibited from practicing their faith openly. Each gift in the song symbolizes a specific aspect of the Catholic faith:



A Partridge in a Pear Tree - *Jesus Christ*

Two Turtle Doves - *Old and New Testament*

Three French Hens - *virtues of Faith, Hope, and Charity*

Four Calling Birds - *Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John (the four Gospels)*

Five Golden Rings - *the first five books of the Old Testament
(the Pentateuch)*

Six Geese A-Laying - *six days of creation*

Seven Swans A-Swimming - *seven gifts of the Holy Spirit*

Eight Maids A-Milking - *eight Beatitudes*

Nine Ladies Dancing - *nine Fruits of the Holy Spirit*

Ten Lords A-Leaping - *the Ten Commandments*

Eleven Pipers Piping - *eleven faithful apostles*

Twelve Drummers Drumming - *twelve points of doctrine in the
Apostles' Creed*

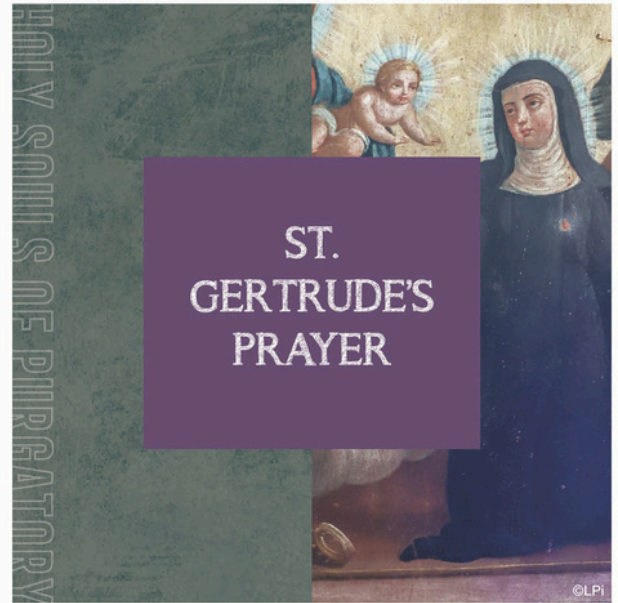

Gospel Meditation

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

When I was ten, my dad gathered our family around the table in small-town Vermont and told us we were moving to the big desert city of Phoenix, Arizona. We were leaving behind family, friends, and everything familiar. None of us knew what to expect.

But something beautiful happened. As we made the move together, our family grew closer. In retrospect, I'm amazed at my parents' courage to go on that adventure. Even as a kid I realized our family found, in that challenge, a deeper unity and mutual love.

In today's Gospel, Joseph is told: **"Rise, take the child and his mother, and flee..." (Matthew 2:13, 20)**. First to Egypt, then later to Israel. The Holy Family is frequently challenged to move and change, to adapt to God's will for them, in order to find safety in the midst of threat. It's not just an idiosyncratic story about survival. It's a spiritual pattern for all of us. Every Christian family is called to be a kind of sanctuary, especially in a world full of noise, busyness, and fear.

May I make a practical application for us? The Lord's Day, Sunday, is perhaps the most practical way we imitate this dynamic we see in Joseph and his family. Sunday is not meant to be just like every other day, filled with errands and stress. It's meant to be a day set apart; a holy "escape" into rest, worship, joy, and peace. A day to rise, take your family, and flee, into God's presence

Mini Reflection: If any four-word sentence encapsulates what we can expect from the Christian life, it is this: God had other plans.

Other Plans

I don't know exactly what kind of life Mary and Joseph envisioned when they were first betrothed — back in those simple times when they were just like any other couple who had hopes, dreams and no angels telling them what to do.

Whatever their plans were, I think it's safe to say that the future God had in store for Mary and Joseph was not one either of them expected. I would imagine they both anticipated something a little quieter. A little more stable (no pun intended). A little less tumultuous.

It exhausts me simply to read through the chaos of their movements in today's Gospel. Flee to Egypt, return to Israel (but not Judea! Herod's son is there! Divert to Galilee! Divert!). Settle in Nazareth (let me remind you, this is all happening with a baby in tow, and without the aid of a minivan). Take a deep breath, but don't get too comfortable — now it's almost time to lose your kid in Jerusalem. Then you'll have about 20 years off before he starts raising people from the dead, and that's when things start to get *really* crazy.

The story of the Holy Family is the ultimate example of the phrase "God had other plans." If any four-word sentence encapsulates what we can expect from the Christian life, it is this.

I thought I was meant for that job, but God had other plans. I thought I would live in this place, but God had other plans. I thought I was supposed to become this person, but God had other plans.

We can do all the right things. We can make all the right choices. We can say, over and over again until our voice wears out, "Thy will be done." But all we can know for sure is that God has other plans.

Why do we do that? Catholic Life Explained

Question:

If I go to the Sacrament of Penance and end up repeating the same sins, does that mean I do not have a strong enough intention to amend my life?

Answer:

There is a popular expression that says, "Be patient. God isn't finished with me yet!" Growing in faith and holiness is an ongoing, life-long project, and our struggle with sin is at the heart of it. As St. Paul says, the good he intends to do, he does not do. The evil he does not intend, he does! It is not always a lack of intention, but more often the allure of evil that makes it difficult to change.

When we confess our sins, we are to come with a fully contrite heart. You need to reflect on your true feelings toward your actions before approaching the sacrament. After confession, there are strategies you can make to avoid falling into the same traps of sin. First, pray for and seek out strength and perseverance through multiple sacraments, charitable work, and personal sacrifice. Second, avoid occasions of sin when you might fail or be sorely tempted. In doing these things, remind yourself daily that it is a spiritual war we wage, and with God's grace, we will succeed.
