POLICY DRIVER SPOTLIGHT ON: The Endangered Species Act (ESA)

The federal Endangered Species Act (ESA), which names threatened and endangered species in the United States, turned **50 years old in 2023!**. When the US Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS) added wolverines to the list in November it brought the total listed animals to 724 (another 939 plants are also listed). It is one of the most far-reaching and influential pieces of environmental legislation ever passed in this country, and the impacts of the ESA continue to drive policy today. There have been roughly 600 proposed changes to try to reduce the reach of the ESA that have not passed to date; however, additional pieces of legislation are continuously being brought forward hoping to dismantle or undermine this important Act.

Since it was signed by President Richard Nixon in Dec. 28, 1973, the <u>Endangered Species Act</u> has included 1,663 animals and plants, of which about 100 have gone extinct and 54 have been de-listed due to recovery and/or reintroduction. **In the past 50** years the ESA has helped keep numerous species from disappearing forever!



National Regulation and Policy Updates

Numerous Revisions to Washington SEPA Regulations Passed within House and Senate Bills in 2023

During the 2023 Legislative session, several bills were enacted related to the State Environmental Policy Act (SEPA), including HB1181, SB5412, HB110, HB1216, HB1173, HB5165, HB1042, and HB1337.

Included are revisions to regulations governing climate change and land use planning, infill housing, middle housing, accessory dwelling units, existing buildings, clean energy projects, transmission projects, and light pollution. These changes may have significant ramifications for both private and public developers as well as consultants, permit writers, and others managing SEPA projects. CWT Academy will be releasing a training on these changes and what they may mean for your projects in early 2024.

States Move to Outlaw Synthetic Landscaping

Artificial turfs and other similar products have become popular across the country for their ease of maintenance and reduction of water usage during periods of drought or water restrictions; however, these products contain a myriad of potential stormwater pollutants that enter our environment when the materials degrade over time and through use and wear. These include microplastics, PFAS 'forever chemicals', and tire breakdown materials. Some states are beginning to take action against synthetic landscaping products, including California, where Governor Newsom <u>recently signed into law</u> legislation that allows local governments to choose to ban these products within their jurisdictions. Other states may follow suit as these pollutants gain more attention with the public and lawmakers.


