

“El agua que mueve México” showcases a whirlwind of expressions centered on a single timeless theme: water.

Among the exhibition’s highlights is a work created by Josefina Soriano de Teresa, titled “In Memoriam.” In the painting, instead of a flame atop the candle, the viewer sees a drop of water shaped like a rising flame.

Another featured piece is “Vida” by Cristian González. The painting shows an elderly man from whom a stream of water flows from his left hand, forming a cascade. This cascade also reveals, in its movement, the heart of the old man—presented as a collection of stars and galaxies. The painting aims to portray the emergence of life, always dependent on vital liquid: water.
