Updated Dress Code

Dress Code for the East Course West Course and Practice Facilities:
Men

- All golf shirts must have collars.
- All mock turtleneck shirts must have a 1-inch collar or more.
- All sandals or open toe shoes must be worn with socks.
- All shorts must be tailored and neat in appearance and no more than 4 to 5 inches above the knee.
- Denim is allowed December – February

Women

- Golf tops with collars, and other current golf fashions, are acceptable.
- Shorts and Skorts of an appropriate length, are acceptable.

Juniors

- Must be consistent with generally-accepted youth golf fashion, similar to adult guidelines above.

Dress Code for the Clubhouse, Golf Shop, Par 3, and Tennis

- Traditional golf or tennis apparel is allowed
- Modest athleticwear is acceptable
- Crew neck athleticwear (not undershirts or casual tee shirts) may be worn
- Hats must be worn forward facing
- Denim is acceptable

NEW CONVENIENCE STATION

A special thank you to two long term members Shea Drummond and John Foley with Select Marketing Distributing for their assistance in taking care of our ice machines every year. Over the last two years you may have noticed the increase in these machines around the property, we could not do it without their assistance. In fact, another one will be making an appearance on the East course near 7 and 13 tee boxes very soon. Maintenance has been working with our electrician to rework all of the electric feeds to these stations as well as all of our water fountains. We hope this work will allow us to have a more reliable product for you.

Those of you that know me well, know how much I despise these ice machines. Actually, the machine is great! Really, it is the few customers who throw trash all over the property and waste the resources. I walk by the locker room ice machines a minimum of 12 times a day. Not one time this entire summer did I not have to pick up cups or straw wrappers off of the ground. The trash can is directly behind the machine, less than two steps to actually clean up after yourself! The club has used 163,000 cups on this property over the last twelve months! Please consider investing in an insulated cup. The golf shop offers a great product from Corksicle. Are you missing one you brought out here? Our lost and found in the golf shop and food and beverage area have dozens that have been left here this summer.



Old Dog New Tricks!

Recently, I was very disappointed in my iron play and the severely declining distances that they travel each year. I had even gotten to the point; I was considering practicing! Fortunately, I mentioned it to Tyler after a round of golf we had played together. He said with your angle of attack I think you need a different iron head with a higher center of gravity. I have played Ping clubs for the last twelve years and I know they have a couple options to fix this issue. I have just enough fitting knowledge and lack of respect for my golf game to be scared of that suggestion.

I grabbed Tyler one day and said let's go through an iron fitting and show me the difference. I took 2 swings and I knew he was onto something. The ball flight went from reaching its apex and falling out of the sky to climbing to its apex and continuing to go forward as it falls. Since my clubs have arrived I have picked up an approximate increase of 10 to 12% in iron distances. Some of my encouraging friends said the iron lofts are stronger, however they are incorrect, they are the exact same lofts.

As avid golfers, we hear and read a lot of recommendations about improving our games. This experience with our golf professional staff reminds me, that nothing beats a trained professional to help fix your golf challenges. Secondly, ball flight both on a monitor and on a range where you can see actual ball flight make a difference. These are the critical parts of the fitting process. Thank you, Tyler!

WINDYKE AGRONOMY

THE SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY OF PRODUCING AND USING PLANTS BY AGRICULTURE FOR RECREATION & BEAUTY.

What a great summer it's been at Windyke. The Agronomy team has done an excellent job working hard to provide consistent playing conditions, while also constantly improving them. As a team, we're always looking for ways to improve no matter how big or small the job. We'll continue this effort into the fall season, which is personally my favorite time of year to play golf. Even though the golf season is winding down, fall provides some of the best and most consistent playing conditions of the year. It's by far the easiest time of year for my staff to provide great conditions. From perfect green speeds, to ideal weather, don't miss out on some great days to enjoy a round over the next couple months.

When having to enter a bunker to retrieve a ball or hit a shot, please remember to rake the disturbed area. Don't just rake the area you disturbed, but also a disturbed area that might be right next to you. We all can do our part to ensure the next shot out of the bunker was on a good lie. It's not just up to the Agronomy staff in the morning to rake bunkers, members must be aware and do a good job raking as well. All new longer rakes have been placed at each bunker. We hope this allows for an easier, more efficient rake for everyone. Please take a look at the link below to get some tips from the USGA on bunker raking. It's a quick, but informative read that can help us all next time we play.

One of the reasons fall conditions are so consistent is because the turf growth slows tremendously. This allows the Agronomy staff time to work on different job tasks instead of focusing on daily course prep. A downside to turf growth slowing is that divots and ball marks don't recover as quickly or at all. That makes repairing pitch marks or adding sand to divots more important than ever. Just like bunker raking, let's be sure we're all doing our part to fix ball marks and sand divots. When repairing ball marks be sure to try and repair 2-3 around your own pitch mark. The same goes for filling your divot. Look for another divot close to yours when in the fairway and always fill 2-3 extra ones when on a par 3 tee box. Just a reminder, if you find your cart is out of divot mix you can find more sand on both the front and back nine on each course. Please take a look at the link below about divot repair.

QUICK TIPS WITH DRIVER:

If you are a player that knows how to launch a high draw, but feel as if it turns into a push or hook too often, consider the simple remedy of teeing the ball low and hitting down on the driver a bit for better accuracy. This tip is used by professionals to dial up a 'fairway finder' and keep the ball in play on narrow holes. Just choke down a bit, tee it low, and hit down on your driver a bit more than usual. Emphasize good shoulder turn through impact to a full finish. This technique straightens the swing path and the ball flight.

If you are a player that slices too much, do the opposite. Tee it high, tilt your spine a bit away from the target, and aim for a hook! There is a bit of trust involved in stopping the slice. Emphasize a good full turn in the backswing, but let the wrists/forearms roll through impact to provide speed instead of the shoulder turn mentioned above. I even tell students to try not to turn through the ball to a finish, but keep the right foot flat as long as possible. This restricts the hips/shoulder turn in the downswing and allows the wrists/forearms to provide the speed and a possible draw shape.

Hope it helps! For more help, call the shop to set up a fall lesson. Fall weather can be the best of the year!

TIME TO VOTE!

It's time to vote to elect new members to the Board of Directors! As there are more candidates than openings for the 2026 Board, an election of the Windyke membership is called. Here are the details:

- Terms are for 3 years starting Jan 1, 2026
- There are 9 candidates, shown below, for 6 open positions.
- Some candidates are existing Board members who are interested in serving another term, others are new candidates.
- There is one vote allowed per membership. Note that most membership classifications can vote, except Tennis, Executive, Heritage, and Non-Resident, who are ineligible to vote per the Windyke by-laws.
- With 6 open positions, you may vote for up to 6 persons, but not more than 6.
- You can vote 2 ways – by submitting your result digitally which will be sent to the membership via email on October 6th or via a paper ballot that can be obtained in the Golf Shop. Paper ballots can only be submitted by returning them to the Golf Shop. Ballots must be signed and include your member number.
- All votes must be submitted by end of day on 10/17/2025.
- Results will be counted prior to the November Board Meeting and ratified by the Board at that meeting.
- Results will be posted shortly after the November meeting.

Guidelines are as follows:

- Four-person scramble format
- Make your own teams or sign up as an individual and we will pair you
- Members and family member guests only, all players must have a GHIN Number.
- Each team's handicap is based on the following formula using each players Course Handicap from the East Course:

Add up the total points and subtract 10. That will be the team handicap or starting position.

Joe Smith	3 = 4 points
John Smith	6 = 3 points
Jared Smith	12 = 2 points
Jim Smith	20 = 1 Point
Total Points	10 - 10 = 0 Handicap
Max Adjustments	+4/-3

Points Formula:

.1 & below	= 5 Points
0 - 3.0	= 4 Points
3.1 - 8.9	= 3 Points
9.0 - 14.9	= 2 Points
15.0 & above	= 1 Point

Tees: Seniors 75 plus play Red tees
Seniors 60-74 play White tees
Juniors 13 and under play Red tees
Female players with a 7.5 index and below play White tees
Female players with a 7.6 index and above play Red tees
Players play Gold tees EXCEPT those with 0.9 indexes and below will play Blue tees

REPAIR BALL MARKS

For those of you that actually repair ball marks, the image above should not need an explanation. For those that do not repair ball marks, take some time away from not returning your shopping cart or using your blinker, and study it. You may see these clipped to players' pockets here at the club. This is not simply for decoration. This is called a divot tool, and it is one of the most important pieces of equipment that you can have with you on the golf course. It is used to fix the ball mark created when a golf ball lands on the putting surface. If you claim that you do not hit enough greens to worry about leaving a ball mark; you are probably right about not hitting many greens, but that is a cheap excuse and we do not want to hear it. Fixing your ball marks leaves the putting surface in good shape for the players behind you and improves the health and appearance of our greens. It costs very little time, very little effort, and benefits every player. If you are reading this and trying to think up a good reason why you don't need repair ball marks, just stop. There is no good excuse. We have also included a simple, visual explanation of the process so you can start practicing.

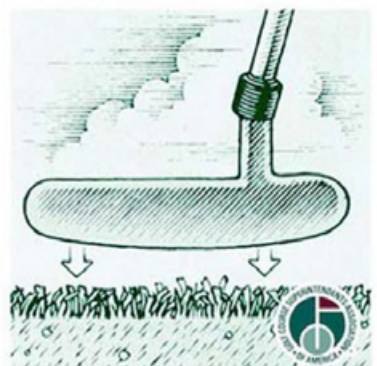
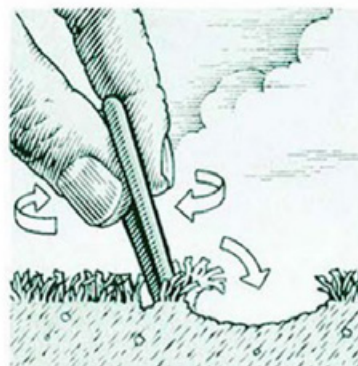
The Proper Way to Repair a Ball Mark

It takes over three weeks for unrepaired pitchmarks to heal, but only a few seconds to fix properly.
Help keep our greens in great shape!

- 1** Use a prolonged ball mark repair tool (preferably), knife, key or tee.
- 2** Insert at the edges of the mark, not at the middle of the depression.



- 3** Bring the edges together with a gentle twisting motion, but never lift the center. Try not to tear the grass.
- 4** Smooth the surface with a club or foot. You're done when it's a surface that you would putt over.

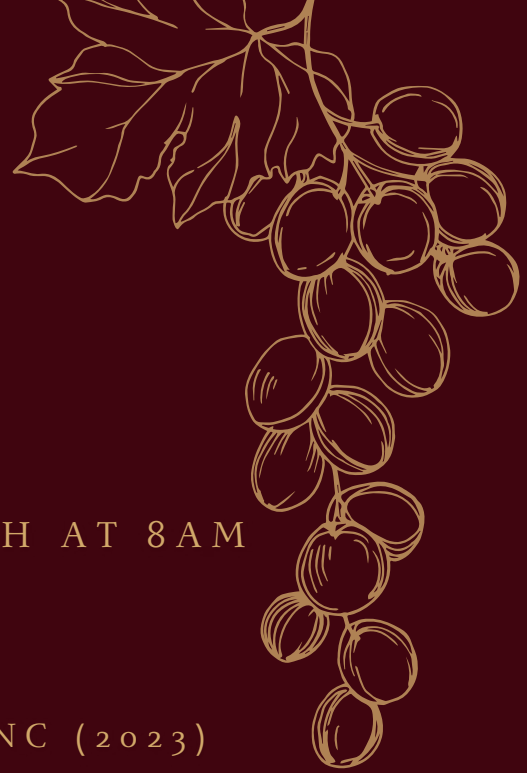
